Families In Crisis, Inc. (FIC) would like to partner with the City of Killeen in its efforts to provide low-barrier, housing-focused crisis beds to persons experiencing homelessness. FIC responded to the City's RFP with a proposal of \$1.3M to increase beds to 100 and to enhance services.

Due to cost, FIC is now requesting gap funding from the City of Killeen to transfer shelter services at the current capacity to the City's proposed reunification center for \$492,218 Year 1.
