FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM GRANTS ACCEPTANCE -TAXIWAY B REHABILITATION PROJECT AT KILLEEN-FORT HOOD REGIONAL AIRPORT

# Background

The Killeen-Fort Hood Regional Airport (KFHRA) staff submitted two (2) grant applications to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for the Rehabilitation of Taxiway B to provide a safe operating environment for Airport users and to provide long-term economic sustainability for the Airport by decreasing maintenance cost and extending the useful life of the taxiway.

### Discussion

- □ The projects consists of:
  - Mill and Overlay of Taxiway B
  - Addition of Shoulders
  - Updating of Taxiway Edge Lighting
  - Reconstruction of Taxiway B 3
  - Replacement of Taxiway Markings

### Discussion

- □ The City has been offered two (2) FAA Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grants for this project.
- □ The first grant is Phase I of the project in the amount of \$4,444,444. The funding comes from FAA supplemental discretionary grant funds and the match will come from the Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) fund in the amount of \$488,618.
- □ Total project cost for Phase I is \$4,933,062.

#### Discussion

- □ The second grant is Phase II of the project in the amount of \$5,444,499. The funding comes from AIP grant funds and the match will come from the PFC fund in the amount of \$88,910.
- □ Total project cost for Phase II is \$5,533,409.
- □ The FAA has notified the City that we will be receiving additional year end funding which will modify this grant up to \$6,348,357 and the additional match would come from the PFC fund.
- No impact to Airport Operating Fund or Fund Balance for this project.
