

DISCUSS SUPPORT OF A CENTRAL TEXAS WATER ALLIANCE

- Texas is the fastest growing state in the country (1,300 new Texans per day) with Bell County and the Central Texas region growing at a faster rate than Texas.
- □ Projected Central Texas water supply shortfall by 2070 is 30,000 to 45,000 ac-ft (9.8 to 14.7 billion gallons).
- Under the leadership of Bell County, several water purveyors, and stakeholders, a Central Texas Water Alliance is potentially forming to be a catalyst to leverage support for near term regional water projects as well as pursue long term water supply for the next generations of Central Texans.

## Background/MOD

- The Central Texas Water Alliance will be created through the passage of legislation authority and filed by local State Representative, Brad Buckley and State Senator, Pete Flores in the 88<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature in 2025.
- County Judge, David Blackburn is requesting a show of support from the entities who will be part of the Alliance.
- Staff is requesting a motion of direction (MOD) from Council to move forward with Killeen's support of the creation of a Central Texas Water Alliance.

To authorize the City Manager to issue a letter of support from the City of Killeen for the creation of a Central Texas Water Alliance.
