AHAS™ Program Description

Deaf Link's Accessible Hazard Alert System (AHAS™) provides Emergency Managers with the ability to send alerts in accessible formats by converting emergency notifications into American Sign Language (ASL) videos with English voice (Spanish language is available) and Text, including text formats readable by web-connected Braille readers. The AHAS program is a Sole Source product from Deaf Link.

AHAS™ is an opt-in subscriber-based system. AHAS™ provides services 24/7 to send accessible emergency information for persons who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Blind, Deaf-Blind or have literacy challenges. Deaf Link and the AHAS™ program support the Access and Functional Needs (AFN) community and persons with sensory disabilities by providing accessible information before, during and after emergency events or disasters. The base program provides Emergency Mangers with 24/7 capability to send unlimited accessible alerts and emergency information in response to Emergency Alert System (EAS) event codes for Warnings, Watches, and Emergencies, Civil Emergency Messages (CEM), Terrorism events, Amber Alerts, and National Weather Service (NWS) watches and warnings as directed by Emergency Management. AHAS is also IPAWS compliant.

Basic Scope of work:

- 1. The AHAS™ program will create and deliver alerts in American Sign Language (ASL) video, English Voice, and Text (maximum length 2 minutes 150 words). All AHAS alerts are sent in email and SMS formats with an associated URL link embedded in the text. AHAS alerts can be received on all video and web enabled cell phones, computers, tablets, and refresh braille readers.
- 2. Deaf Link will create an AHAS accessible website where accessible information about AHAS, Active Alerts, FAQs, and Preparedness videos in ASL, English voice/text can be viewed by the community. The AHAS site will also include an ASL/English based subscriber registration page and database.
- 3. Deaf Link will include production of 2 accessible preparedness videos for the City of Killeen. Videos will be produced in ASL with English voice and closed captions. The topics are selected by Killeen EM. Scripts can be submitted to Deaf Link in a Word doc. Maximum length is 400 words.
- 4. The AHAS system will operate as a stand-alone program for delivery of accessible emergency alerts and information. AHAS can also work in conjunction with other Emergency Notification Systems (ENS) should Killeen EM want to pursue an integration with their current Emergency Notification System (CodeRed).
