# Background

 In August 2021, City Council gave direction for staff to explore closed captioning options when broadcasting meetings

- Closed Captioning will meet Americans with Disabilities Act
  (ADA) compliance requirements for hearing-impaired citizens
  - The City wishes to reach community members who may require accommodations of audio/visual feeds for public meetings
  - This will help reach a broader audience for webcasting/live broadcasts of public meetings

- Staff conducted on-site testing and visited agencies using closed captioning technology.

- Three vendors were tested with the City's current broadcast system, including ENCO, Swagit and Granicus.
  - Granicus is our current vendor for internet streaming of meetings and has a cost of \$102K, with increases annually.

After extensive, on-site tests of each vendor, a solution at no cost offers the best solution at the time— The City's YouTube.com channel. Research on Central Texas Cities found that use of live/closed captioning is <u>not</u> provided at every City Council meeting.

- Those cities include: Copperas Cove, Belton, Temple, Georgetown, Round Rock, Midland, Waco, Amarillo, Grand Prairie, (Frisco- not live); also, Killeen Independent School District board meetings
  - (Texas Cities with populations from 20K-200K)

■ Some cities also provide meetings via a YouTube broadcast (recorded and/or live), which provides captions at no cost.

## **Background Continued**

□ It has been, and will continue to be, difficult to measure the full benefit to the community using the existing meeting management system

State and local governments: In determining whether a particular aid or service would result in *undue financial and administrative burdens*, a Title II entity should take into consideration the **cost** of the particular aid or service in light of all resources available to fund the program, service, or activity and the effect on other expenses or operations. The decision that a particular aid or service would result in an undue burden must be made by a high level official, no lower than a Department head, and must include a written statement of the reasons for reaching that conclusion (<a href="https://www.ada.gov/effective-comm.htm">https://www.ada.gov/effective-comm.htm</a>)

 Do not authorize the procurement of a closed captioning system / accommodations for the hearing impaired

 Authorize the procurement of the closed captioning system from Granicus to provide accommodations for the hearing impaired, in the amount not to exceed \$102,000 for FY 23 (PEG funds option <u>not</u> available due to recurring fee)

 Authorize meeting recordings to be placed on the City's YouTube channel with a closed captioning service option at no cost, and continue with American Sign Language (ASL) option by request

### Recommendation

 Staff recommends that City Council authorize meeting recordings to be placed on the City's YouTube channel with closed captioning services option at no cost
