Background and Findings

- ❑ On July 23, 2019, the City Council adopted the 2020-2024 Capital Improvement Program that included Chaparral Road.
- ❑ On September 20, 2022 the City, Bell County, and Harker Heights entered into an Interlocal Agreement for the Chaparral Road project.
- ❑ Due to concerns raised by the residents of Featherline and Chaparral, Bell County performed a traffic study of the intersections of Featherline and by Chaparral High School.
- ❑ The study showed there is a current need for signals due to the school and peak hour traffic.

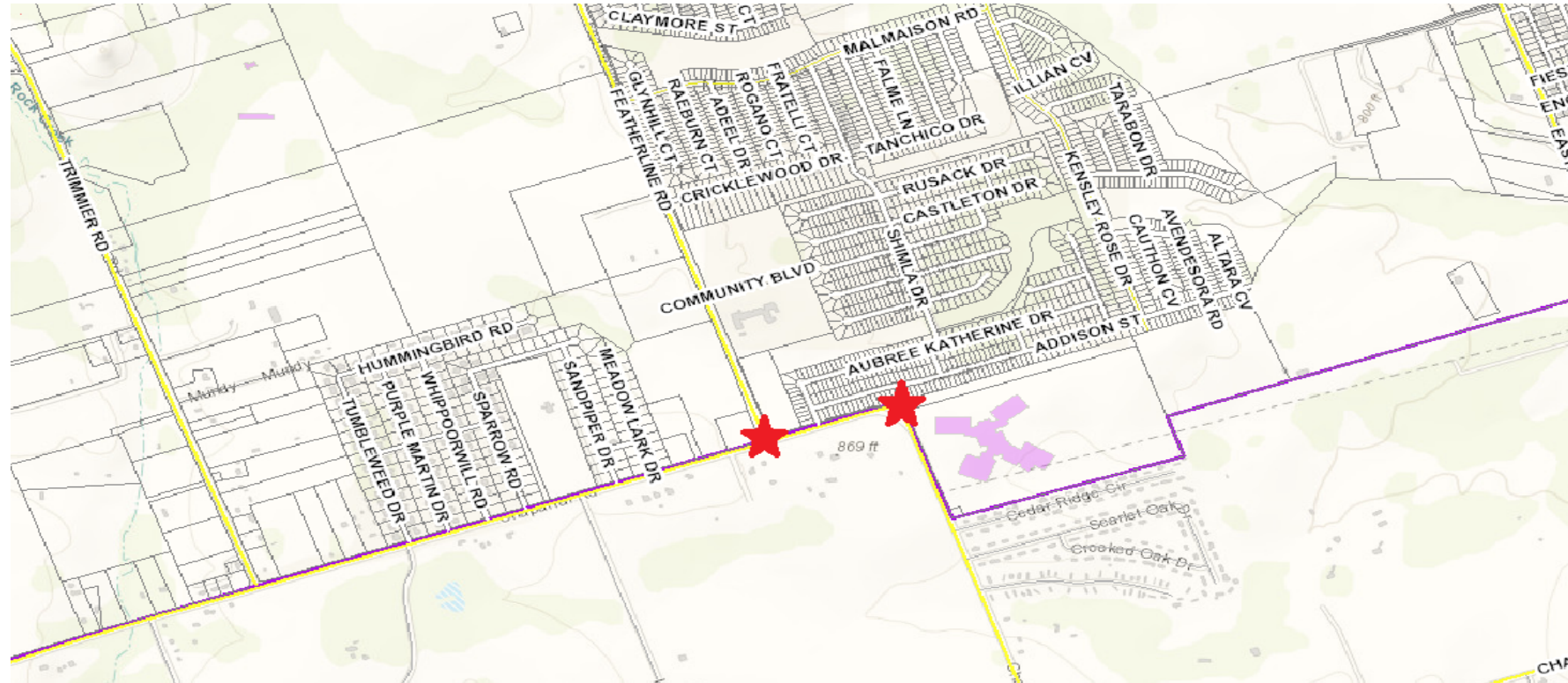
Background and Findings

- ❑ The county currently has no county engineer, or staff that maintains signals.
- ❑ Bell County would like to move forward with new signals at those locations and has requested the assistance of the City.
- ❑ The City would bid and manage the construction of the project and perform the needed maintenance on the traffic signals.
- ❑ The County would reimburse the city for the costs associated with any remaining design, relocation of franchise utilities and construction.
- ❑ Once constructed the City would take ownership of the signals.
