### INTRODUCTION

The City of Killeen Community Development Department provides Federal funding to promote suitable living environments, expand economic opportunities for persons of Killeen – including low and moderate income persons, and to meet affordable housing needs. Funding is made available through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) formula grant programs; specifically Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME).

These funds provide city departments and local organizations with a means to enhance public services, public facilities, and public improvements. Public facilities and improvements include construction, rehabilitation, and /or renovation of housing and buildings, street reconstruction projects, sewer and waterline rehabilitation projects, parks and recreation projects and other related construction projects. Affordable housing activities include new construction, substantial rehabilitation, accessibility modifications, and/or renovation to vacant or occupied housing units.

In order to complete these projects, the City contracts with reputable, experienced contractors to provide quality results in expenditure of its federal funding. The Community Development Department is also required, to the greatest extent feasible; to include employment and/or contracting opportunities arising out of expenditure of HUD funding, be made available to low- and very-low income persons and business owners, and business owners that employ low-income individuals, particularly those who are recipients of government assistance for housing. As governed by 24 CFR Part 135-Economic Opportunities for Low- and Very Low-Income Persons. Contractors interested in participating in City of Killeen Community Development Department projects must complete the qualification and certification application/approval process (QCAP). The certification process must be complete prior to an award of any Community Development Department federally funded construction project. Construction projects (excluding single-unit housing rehabilitation/reconstruction) with total construction related costs exceeding \$2,000 require compliance with Davis-Bacon and Related Acts with payment of prevailing wage rates to all persons employed and or subcontracted to work on the project. Additionally, certified payroll documentation compliance is required and must be submitted weekly throughout the project.

Upon approval and contract award, QCAP contractors and their subcontractors, along with their employees, are expected to maintain a certain level of professionalism and keep an open line of communication between program staff, city departments, and project owners for the duration of the project schedule. This method will insure the federally funded projects are completed to everyone's satisfaction.

Community Development Staff is available to meet with contractors to provide a brief orientation on the application, bidding procedures, and program operations. Applicants will have an opportunity to ask questions, become familiar with program rules and regulations, and to meet with program staff. Technical assistance with this application, bid documents and governing regulations will also be provided by Community Development Staff.

Interaction between the contractor, the city and owner is essential and necessary to bring about the success of any project. We look forward to your participation and cooperation in assisting us with achieving our goals in meeting the needs of our communities.

### **DEFINITIONS**

The following terms and phrases are defined as follows:

Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion for Covered Contracts shall mean compliance with federal rules implementing Executive Order 12549 and 12689 regarding debarment, suspension or other Government-wide exclusion initiated as the result of a sanctioned party from further participation in HUD procurement and non-procurement programs and other Federal Government programs as a measure to ensure the highest standards of professional conduct and ethical business practices by the Federal Government's business partners.

"Minority Person" shall mean citizens of the United States, whose identity affiliation exists among one or more of the following groups whose members are:

- a. **Asian-Indian (subcontinent Asian):** a U.S. citizen whose origins are from India, Pakistan and Bangladesh, Bhutan, the Maldives Islands, Nepal or Sri Lanka.
- b. **Asian-Pacific**: a U.S. citizen whose origins are from Japan, China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Taiwan, Korea, Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, the Philippines, Thailand, Samoa, Guam, and the U.S. Trust Territories of the Pacific or the Northern Marianas.
- c. Black: a U.S. citizen having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa:
- d. **Hispanic**: a U.S. citizen of true-born Hispanic heritage, from any of the Spanish-speaking areas of the following regions: Mexico, Central America, South America and the Caribbean Basin only;
- e. Native American: a person who is an American Indian, Eskimo, Aleut or Native Hawaiian, and regarded as such by the community of which the person claims to be a member of a North American tribe, band or otherwise organized group of native people who are indigenous to the continental United States and proof can be provided through a Native American Blood Degree Certificate (i.e., tribal registry letter, tribal roll register number).

"Minority-owned Business" or "MBE" shall mean a for-profit enterprise, regardless of size, physically located in the United States or its trust territories, which is owned, operated and controlled by minority group members.

"Minority group members" are United States citizens who are:

- a. **Asian-Indian (subcontinent Asian)**: a U.S. citizen whose origins are from India, Pakistan and Bangladesh, Bhutan, the Maldives Islands, Nepal or Sri Lanka.
- b. **Asian-Pacific**: a U.S. citizen whose origins are from Japan, China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Taiwan, Korea, Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, the Philippines, Thailand, Samoa, Guam the U.S. Trust Territories of the Pacific or the Northern Marianas.
- c. Black: a U.S. citizen having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa:
- d. **Hispanic**: a U.S. citizen of true-born Hispanic heritage, from any of the Spanish-speaking areas of the following regions: Mexico, Central America, South America and the Caribbean Basin only:
- e. Native American: a person who is an American Indian, Eskimo, Aleut or Native Hawaiian, and regarded as such by the community of which the person claims to be a member of a North American tribe, band or otherwise organized group of native people who are indigenous to the continental United States and proof can be provided through a Native American Blood Degree Certificate (i.e., tribal registry letter, tribal roll register number).

"Ownership by minority individuals" means the business:

- i. which is at least 51% owned by such individuals or, in the case of publicly-owned business, at least 51% of the stock is owned by one or more such individuals;
- ii. whose management, policies, major decisions and daily business operations are controlled by those minority group members;

"Section 3 Economic Opportunities for Low- and Very Low-Income Persons" or "Section 3" shall mean Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended.

Low and Very Low-Income includes persons whose incomes do not exceed 80% of the median income for the Killeen-Temple, Fort Hood Area; Very Low-Income includes persons whose incomes do not exceed 50% of the median income or the Killeen-Temple, Fort Hood Area.

Section 3 Business Concern (s3BC) means a business concern, as defined as:

- a. 51% or more of the business is owned by section 3 residents (recipients eligible for housing and community development assistance available through HUD programs;
- b. Whose permanent, full-time employees include persons, at least 30% of whom are currently section 3 residents, or within 3 years of the date of first employment with the business were section 3 residents; or
- c. That provides evidence of a commitment to subcontract in excess of 25% of the dollar award of all subcontracts to be awarded to business concerns that meet the qualifications set forth in (a) or (b) above.

**Section 3 Business Registry** means a listing of firms that have self-certified that they meet one of the regulatory definitions of a Section 3 business and are included in a searchable online database that can be used by agencies that receive HUD funds, developers, contractors, and others to facilitate the award of certain HUD-funded contracts; the registry can also be used by Section 3 residents to identify businesses that may have HUD-funded employment opportunities.

A Section 3 Business Concern may be required to provide evidence of eligibility factors ensuring they meet the definition of a Section 3 Business Concern as defined by HUD's regulations at 24 CFR 135.5

### HCS Inc. Commercial General Contractor Notes to the Financial Statements December 31, 2021

### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This summary of significant accounting policies of HCS Inc. General Contractor (the Company) is presented to assist in understanding the Company's financial statements. The financial statements and notes are representations of the Company's management who is responsible for their integrity and objectivity. These accounting policies conform to generally accepted accounting principles and have been consistently applied in the preparation of the financial statements.

### **Nature of Operations**

The Company was incorporated in the state of Texas in 1997 and is engaged in the installation and related service of commercial and residential buildings.

### Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company considers all highly liquid investments with maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

### **Contracts Receivable**

Contracts receivable are recorded on construction contracts and include billed and unbilled amounts for services provided to customers for which the Company has an unconditional right to payment. Biled and unbilled amounts for which payment is contingent on anything other than the passage of time are included in contract assets and contract liabilities on a net basis at the individual contract level.

Retainage for which the Company has an unconditional right to payment that is only subject to the passage of time is included in contracts receivable and amounted to \$0 at December 31, 2021. Management provides for probable uncollectible amounts through a charge to earnings and a credit to a valuation allowance based on its assessment of the current status of individual accounts. Balances still outstanding after management has used reasonable collections efforts are written off through a charge to the valuation allowance and a credit to contracts receivable. The Company considers all receivables to be fully collectible; accordingly, no allowance for doubtful accounts is required.

### Plant, Property and Equipment

Plant, property and equipment are carried at cost and include expenditures for improvements and betterments which substantially increase the useful lives of existing plant and equipment. Maintenance and repairs are expensed as incurred unless it significantly prolongs the useful life of the asset. When properties are retired or otherwise disposed of, the related cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the respective accounts and any profit or loss is credited or charged to income.



Depreciation of property and equipment is provided using the straight-line method over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation expense for property and equipment is included in costs of goods sold and operating expenses.

### **Revenue and Cost Recognition**

Contract costs include all direct material, subcontractors and direct labor costs and those indirect costs related to contract performance, such as indirect labor, supplies, tools, and repairs. Other selling, general, and administrative costs are charged to expense as incurred. Provisions for estimated losses on uncompleted contracts are made in the period in which such losses are determined. Changes in job performance, job conditions, and estimated profitability, including those arising from contract penalty provisions, and final contract settlements may result in revisions to costs and income, which are recognized in the period in which the revisions are determined. Profit incentives or contract costs attributable to claims are included in income during the period when realization is probable, and the amounts can be reliably estimated.

The asset, "Contract Assets" represents revenues recognized in excess of amounts billed. The liability, "Contract Liabilities," represents billings in excess of revenues recognized.

Please refer to footnote 14 for expanded disclosures related to revenue from contracts with customers.

### **Compensated Absences**

Employees of the Company are entitled to paid vacations depending on job classification, length of service and other factors. Vacations are taken in the year earned. The Company does not allow employees to carryover unused vacation time to the next year. Therefore, the Company has not accrued any liability for compensated absences.

### Warranty

The Company does not have a company-wide warranty clause in place as of December 31, 2021, but rather provides individual warranties on a per job basis. The Company maintains an estimated warranty reserve based on past experience and costs incurred. Warranty work performed for the period ended December 31, 2021 was \$0.

### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual amounts could differ from these estimates. Significant estimates to the financial statements include useful lives of property and equipment, allowance for doubtful accounts, liability for pension benefits and estimated earnings on contracts in progress.



### **Advertising**

The Company expenses advertising as incurred and had \$6,794 in advertising expense for the period ended December 31, 2021.

### **Income Taxes**

The Company has elected to be taxed under the provisions of Subchapter S of the Internal Revenue Code for the year beginning September 18, 1997. Under those tax provisions the Company generally does not pay federal corporate income taxes on its taxable income. Instead, the stockholder is liable for individual income taxes on his share of the Company's taxable income for federal tax purposes. Therefore, no provision or liability for federal or state income taxes has been included in the financial statements.

The Company believes that it has appropriate support for any tax positions taken, and as such, does not have any uncertain tax positions that are material to the financial statements. The Corporations federal and state tax returns are subject to examination by the IRS, generally for three years after they were filed and by the Texas State Comptroller generally for four years after they were filed. The Company remains subject to examination by the IRS for years ending after December 31, 2018 and by the Texas State Comptroller for years ending after December 31, 2017.

### Fair Value of Financial Instruments

Billed:

The Company's financial instruments consist primarily of cash, receivables, accounts payable and debt. The carrying amounts of cash, receivables and accounts payable approximates fair value due to the short maturity of these financial instruments. The carrying value of short and long-term debts approximates fair value because those financial instruments bear interest at rates that approximate current market rates for loans with similar maturities and credit quality.

### 5. Forgivable Loans Received Under the Small Business Administration Paycheck Protection Program

In response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak in 2020, the U.S. Federal Government enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act that, among other economic stimulus measures, established the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) to provide small business loans. On April 17, 2020, the Company obtained an unsecured PPP loan for \$246,500 set to mature on April 17, 2022 bearing interest at a fixed annual rate of 1%, with the first six months of interest deferred. The Company used all of the proceeds from the note for qualifying expenses and thus received forgiveness of the loan balance plus accrued interest on January 6, 2021, at which time the Company recognized a gain on forgiveness of the loan.

### 6. Note Payable – Line of Credit

The Company has a revolving line of credit with American Bank in the amount of \$650,000 with an interest rate of 3.25% maturing June 29, 2022, secured by accounts receivable. As of December 31, 2021, the outstanding balance was \$60,000.

The Company has an unsecured revolving line of credit utilizing a credit card with Wells Fargo in the amount of \$150,000, with an interest rate of 8.75%. There are no specified terms for this line of credit. At December 31, 2021, the outstanding balance was \$0.

### 8. Lease Commitments

The Company rented office space in Georgetown, Texas under a month-to-month lease. The lease called for a monthly rent of \$2,000. The lease terminated in June 2021. Total rental expense under the lease for the year ended December 31, 2021 was \$10,000.

The Company leases various lots on an as needed basis for storage. Total rental expense under these agreements for the year ended December 21, 2021 was \$11,550.

### 9. Related Party Transactions

During the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company advanced funds to its stockholders. The advances are non-interest bearing and have no formal repayment terms. At December 31, 2021, advances to stockholders totaled \$643,286.



### 10. Concentrations of Credit Risk

The Company's financial instruments that are exposed to concentrations of credit risk consist primarily of cash and cash equivalents. The Company deposits its cash with high credit quality institutions. However, at times, such investments may be in excess of FDIC Insurance limits. The cash balances in the financial institution are insured up to \$250,000 at each institution. At December 31, 2021, the Company's uninsured cash balances were \$1,056,048.

The Company's customers are primarily located in Texas and therefore an unforeseen change in general economic condition in Texas, may impact the Company's business and its ability to generate sufficient operating income. The Company extends credit to its customers in the ordinary course of its business.

Approximately 90% of the Company's revenue was derived from six customers for the year ending December 31, 2021. Approximately 0% of the Company's revenue was derived from the federal government, of which \$0 was included in accounts receivable at year end. As of December 31, 2021, approximately 89% of the receivables consist of amounts due from six major customers.

Twenty-six major suppliers accounted for approximately 65% of total purchases for the year ended December 31, 2021. As of December 31, 2021, approximately 65% of the payables consist of amounts due to nineteen vendors.

### 11. Defined Contribution Plan

During 2017, the Company established a defined contribution 401(k) profit sharing plan. Participation in this plan is available to substantially all employees upon completing one year of service. The plan features include salary deferrals, 3% safe harbor contributions, and profit-sharing contributions. The Company's profit-sharing contributions for the year amounted to \$69,557.

### 12. Defined Benefit Plan

The Company sponsors a defined benefit cash balance pension plan covering substantially all of its employees. The benefits are based on a hypothetical account that is maintained for each participant in which pay credits are credited to the participant's account for the benefit of the individual. The Company's funding policy is to make the minimum annual contribution required by applicable regulations. Contributions are intended to provide not only for benefits attributed to service to date but also for those expected to be earned in the future. Expected company contributions in 2022 are \$201,861.

We account for this plan under the immediate recognition method, under which actuarial gains and losses are recognized in our Statement of Income in the year in which the gains and losses occur rather than deferring them into Other Comprehensive Income (Loss) and amortizing them over future periods. These amounts do not reflect current compensation costs and are recorded outside of Income From Operations, within Other Income (Loss) on our Statement of Income. During 2021, we recognized a gain of \$326,532.

The Company's overall investment strategy is to provide both security and long-term stability with moderate growth commensurate with the anticipated retirement dates of participants. Investments, other than "fixed-dollar" investments, should be included among the plan's investments to prevent erosion by inflation. However, investments should be sufficiently liquid to enable the plan, on short notice, to make some distributions in the event of the death or disability of a participant. The Company's investment policy does not contain target allocation ranges. Instead, funds are to be invested without distinction between principal and income and in such securities or property, real or personal, wherever situated, as the Trustee shall deem advisable, including, but not limited to stocks, common or preferred, open-end or closed-end mutual funds, bonds and other evidences of indebtedness or ownership, and real estate or any interest therein. The objective is to ensure assets are invested with the intent to protect pension plan assets so that such assets are preserved for the provision of benefits to participants and their beneficiaries and such long-term growth as may maximize the amounts available to provide such benefits without undue risk.

The following table set forth the Company's pension plan assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis at December 31, 2021. These assets have been categorized according to the three-level fair value hierarchy established by the FASB which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. Level 1 is based on quoted prices for the asset in active markets. ### 13. Surety Bond

The Company, as conditions for entering into some construction contracts, had outstanding surety bonds as of December 31, 2021.

### 14. Recognition of Revenue

The Company earns revenue from general commercial construction projects where the Company typically provides general contracting, design-build contracting, and construction manager to their clients. The Company has the capability to execute a project from inception to completion which includes design build, data analysis and total commercial construction capabilities.

All revenue streams for the Company discussed above are within the scope of and accounted for under ASC 606. ASC 606 requires revenue to be recognized when the Company satisfies the related performance obligations by transferring to the customer a good or service through a 5-step process:

- 1) Identify the contract with the customer,
- 2) Identify the associated performance obligations,
- 3) Determine the transaction price,
- 4) Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations, and
- 5) Recognize revenue when the performance obligations have been satisfied and the good or service has been transferred.

For general commercial construction, revenue is satisfied over time – primarily a year or less. Revenues are recognized using the input method and based upon actual costs incurred relative to total estimated contract costs to determine, as a percentage, our progress toward contract completion. Costs incurred that do not contribute to satisfying our performance obligations are excluded from our cost input calculation as these amounts are not reflective of our transferring control to the customer. We believe the cost-based input method is the most faithful depiction of our performance because it directly measures the value of the services transferred to the customer.

The Company's source materials are construction related and determined on a job by job basis, if the market prices increase and/or resources become scarce it could impact the Company's ability to bid on jobs or affect the timing of jobs. Other general economic factors that could impact the Company are inflation, obsolescence and interest rates.

Contracts are often modified through change orders to account for changes in scope and price of goods and services the Company is providing. Although the Company evaluates each change order to determine whether such modifications create a separate performance obligation, the majority of change orders are for goods or services that are not distinct within the context of the original contract and therefore not treated as separate performance obligations.

Revisions in estimated contract profits are made in the year in which circumstances requiring the revision become known. During 2021, supply chain issues, theft issues and an increase in the price of materials, equipment and labor caused material additional costs for one job. Management estimates the impact of these issues will reduce these contracts gross profit by \$171,031. The change in estimate reduced 2021 net income by \$274,163 of which \$9,057 was not a result of performance in the current period.



Revenues on uninstalled materials are recognized when control is transferred to the customer, which for us does not necessarily equate to when the cost is incurred. Under limited circumstance (e.g., transfer of control occurs significantly before we provide services, the cost of the material is significant), we recognize revenue, but no profit, on certain uninstalled third-party materials when the cost is incurred.

The Company generally provides limited warranties for work performed under its construction contracts. The warranty periods typically extend for a limited duration following substantial completion of the Company's work on a project. Historically, warranty claims have not resulted in material costs incurred.

The Company does not have any significant financing components related to contracts satisfied over time as payment is typically received at or shortly after completion of the contract.

The amounts included within contract assets and contract liabilities are related to the company's long-term construction contracts. Retainage for which the Company has an unconditional right to payment that is only subject to the passage of time is classified as contracts receivable. Retainage subject to conditions other than the passage of time are included in contract assets and contract liabilities on a net basis at the individual contract level.

Contract assets represent revenues recognized in excess of amounts paid or payable (contract receivable) to the Company on uncompleted contract. Contract assets include unbilled amounts typically resulting from sales under contracts when percentage-of-completion method of revenue recognition is utilized, and revenue recognized exceeds the amount billed to the customer. Contract liabilities represent the Company's obligation to perform on uncompleted contracts with customers for which the Company has received payment or for which contracts receivable are outstanding.



## TEXAS WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION RULE 28 TAC § 110.110

Article. Workers' Compensation Insurance Coverage.

### A. Definitions:

Certificate of coverage ("certificate") - A copy of a certificate of insurance, a certificate of authority to self-insure issued by the commission, or a coverage agreement (TWCC-81, TWCC-82, TWCC-83, or TWCC-84), showing statutory workers' compensation insurance coverage for the person's or entity's employees providing services on a project, for the duration of the project.

Duration of the project - includes the time from the beginning of the work on the project until the contractor's/person's work on the project has been completed and accepted by the governmental entity.

Persons providing services on the project ("subcontractor" in § 406.096) - includes all persons or entities performing all or part of the services the contractor has undertaken to perform the project, regardless of whether that person contracted directly with the contractor and regardless of whether that person has employees. This includes, without limitation, independent contractors, subcontractors, leasing companies, motor carriers, owner-operators, employees of any such entity, or employees of any entity which furnishes persons to provide services on the project. "Services" include, without limitation, providing, hauling, or delivering equipment or materials, or providing labor, transportation, or other service related to a project. "Services" does not include activities unrelated to the project, such as food/beverage vendors, office supply deliveries, and delivery of portable toilets.

- B. The contractor shall provide coverage, based on properly reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts and filing of all coverage agreements, which meets the statutory requirements of Texas Labor Code, Section 401.011(44) for al employees of the contractor providing services on the project, for the duration of the project.
- C. The contractor must provide a certificate of coverage to the governmental entity prior to being awarded the contract.
- D. If the coverage period shown on the contractor's current certificate of coverage ends during the duration of the project, the contractor must, prior to the end of the coverage period, file a new certificate of coverage with the governmental entity showing that coverage has been extended.
- E. The contractor shall obtain from each person to whom it contracts providing services on a project, and provide to the governmental entity:
- (1) a certificate of coverage, prior to that person beginning work on the project, so the governmental entity will have on file certificates of coverage showing coverage for all persons providing services on the project: and
- (2) no later than seven days after receipt by the contractor, a new certificate of coverage showing extension of coverage, if the coverage period shown on the current certificate of coverage ends during the duration of the project.
- F. The contractor shall retain all required certificates of coverage for the duration of the project and for one year thereafter.
- G. The contractor shall notify the governmental entity in writing by certified mail or personal delivery, within 30 days after the contractor knew or should have known, of any change that materially affects the provision of coverage of any persons providing services on the project.
- H. The contractor shall post on each project site a notice, in the text, form and manner prescribed by the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission, informing all persons providing services on the project that they are required to be covered, and stating how a person may verify coverage and report lack of coverage.
- I. The contractor shall contractually require each person with whom it contracts to provide services on a project, to:
- (1) provide coverage, based on proper reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts and filing of any coverage agreements, which meets the statutory requirements of Texas Labor Code, Section 401.011 (44) for all of its employees providing services on the project, for the duration of the project;
- (2) provide to the contractor, prior to that person beginning work on the project, a certificate of coverage showing that coverage is being provided for all employees of the person providing services on the project, for the duration of the project; CITY OF KILLEEN

Providing false or misleading information may subject the contractor to administrative penalties, criminal penalties, civil penalties, or other civil actions.
- K. The contractor's failure to comply with any of these provisions is a breach of contract by the contractor, which entitles the governmental entity to declare the contract void if the contractor does not remedy the breach within ten days after receipt of notice of breach from the governmental entity.

# APPENDIX A CITY OF KILLEEN GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### 1. General Conditions

Bidders are required to submit their Bid upon the following express conditions:

- (a) Bidders shall make all investigation necessary to thoroughly inform themselves regarding plant and facilities for delivery of material and equipment as required by the Bid conditions. No plea of ignorance by the bidder of conditions that exist or that may hereafter exist as a result of failure or omission on the part of the bidder to make the necessary examinations and investigations, or failure to fulfill in every detail the requirements of the contract documents, will be accepted as a basis for varying the requirements of the City or the compensation to the bidder.
- (b) Unless specifically stated otherwise in the specifications, only new products or equipment will be acceptable.

### 2. Preparation of Bid

Bid will be prepared in accordance with the following:

- (a) All information required by the Bid shall be furnished. The bidder shall print or type his/her name and manually or electronically sign the Bid and each continuation sheet on which an entry is made.
- (b) Unit prices shall be shown and where there is an error in extension of the price, the unit price shall govern.
- (c) Alternate Bids will not be considered unless authorized by the City within the specifications.
- (d) Proposed delivery time must be shown and shall include weekends and holidays if requested by the City.
- (e) The City qualifies for exemption from State and Local Sales and Use Taxes pursuant to the provision of Article 20.04(f) of the Texas Limited Sales, Excise and Use Tax Act. Taxes normally levied on the purchase, rental and lease of materials, supplies and equipment used or consumed in performance of the Contract may be exempted by issuing to suppliers an exemption certificate in lieu of tax. Exemption certificates comply with State Comptroller of Public Accounts Ruling No. 95-0.07. Any such exemption certificate issued in lieu of tax shall be subject to State Comptroller of Public Accounts Ruling No. 95-0.09, as amended. Failure by the Bidder or the bidder's Subcontractors s to take advantage of the City's exemption and to obtain such exemption certificate shall make him responsible for paying taxes incurred on materials furnished on the Project without additional cost to or reimbursement by the City.

### 3. Description of Supplies

Any catalog of manufacturer's reference used in describing an item is merely descriptive, and not restrictive, unless otherwise noted, and is used only to indicate type and quality of material. Bidders are required to state exactly what they intend to furnish; otherwise they will be required to furnish the item as specified.

### 4. Submission of Bid

By submitting your Bid, you acknowledge that the City of Killeen will not accept any Bid, or execute any submitted contract in conjunction with a Bid that requires the City to agree to any of the following:

- Governing law other than the law of the State of Texas
- Venue other than Bell County
- Mandatory arbitration
- Artificial limitation of liability
- Artificial statute of limitation
- Waiver of trial by jury
- Indemnify a vendor
- (a) Bidders are encouraged to submit bids electronically through the City's OpenGov e-Bidding website below, however, if submitted by mail or hand delivered; bid and changes thereto shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the Purchasing Office, City of Killeen at the address below. The names and address of Bidder, the date and hour of the Bid opening and the Bid number shall be placed on the outside of the envelope.
- (b) Bids must be submitted on the forms furnished. Telegraphic Bids will not be considered. However, Bids may be modified by written notice provided such notice is received prior to the time and date set for the Bid opening.
- (c) All Bid documents shall be sealed and submitted no later than the specified date and hour of the Bid opening to:

### 5. Rejection of Bid

- (a) The City may reject a Bid if:
  - 1. The Bidder mistakes or conceals any material fact in the Bid, or if
  - 2. The Bid does not strictly conform to law or the requirements of the Bid, or if
  - 3. The Bid is conditional, except that the Bidder may qualify his Bid for acceptance by the City as an "All or None" basis.
- (b) The City may, however, reject all Bids whenever it is deemed in the best interest of the City to do so, and may reject any part of a Bid unless the Bid has been qualified as provided in section 5(a) 3 above.

### 6. Withdrawal of Bid

A bidder may withdraw a bid that has been submitted at any time up to the due date and time. To accomplish this, a written request signed by an authorized representative of the bidder must be submitted to the Director of Procurement and Contract Management at <a href="mailto:lluciano@killeentexas.gov">lluciano@killeentexas.gov</a>. All bids shall be valid for a period of ninety (90) days after the bid opening

### 7. Late Bid or Modifications

Bid and modifications received after the time set for the Bid opening will not be considered.

### 8. Clarification or Objection to Bid Specifications

If any person contemplating submitting a Bid for this contract is in doubt as to the true meaning of the specifications, or other Bid documents, or any part thereof, he may submit to Purchasing, a request for clarification by the deadline established in the Bid. All such requests for information shall be made in writing and the person submitting the request will be responsible for its prompt delivery. Any interpretation of the Bid, if made, will be made only by an addendum duly issued. A copy of such addendum will be distributed to all known bidders who have expressed an interest in this bid. The City will not be responsible for any other explanation or interpretation of the proposed Bid made or given prior to the award of the contract. Any objection to the specifications and requirements, as set forth in the Bid documents must be filed in writing with the Purchasing Division by the deadline established in the Bid.

### 9. Discounts

- (a) Prompt payment discounts will be considered in making the award provided the period of the discount offered is sufficient to permit payment within such period in the regular course of business.
- (b) In connection with any discount offered, time will be computed from the date of receipt of supplies or services or from the date a correct invoice is received, whichever is the later date. Payment is deemed to be made on the date of mailing of the check.

### 10. Award of the Contract

- (a) The contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. "Lowest responsible bidder" means the Bidder submitting the lowest bid meeting all requirements of the specifications, instructions, and terms and conditions of the bid and who has the financial and practical ability to fully and reliably perform all obligations of the Contract, taking into consideration qualifications and past performance of the Bidder. The following are considered examples of performance that is not responsible and may lead to a determination that the Bidder is not responsible:
  - \* Falsification of information provided in bid response;
  - \* Non-observance of safety requirements;
  - \* Failure to meet requirements of federal, state, or local law, as applicable, including employment;
  - \* Substantial failure to adhere to contractually agreed-upon schedules; and
  - \* Poor past performance on City projects such as use of defective materials, refusal to correct defective work not in accordance with contract documents, failure to reasonably resolve disputes, termination for cause, or performance leading to litigation.

Determination of most advantageous Bid for the municipality may be based on, but not limited to:

- \* Unit price
- \* Total Bid price
- \* Terms and discounts
- \* Delivery date
- \* Product warranty
- \* Special needs and requirements of City
- \* Past experience with product/service
- \* City's evaluation of the bidder's ability, financial, strength, and ethical standards
- \* Quality of the bidder's goods or services
- \* The extent to which the goods or services meet the municipality's needs

- \* Bidder's past performance
- \* Demurrage charges, freight costs and mileage
- \* Estimated costs of supplies, maintenance, etc.
- \* Estimated surplus value, life expectancy

- \* Conformity to specifications
- \* Training requirements, location, etc.
- \* Location of maintenance facility/service person; ability to provide for minimum down time
  The total long-term cost to the municipality to acquire the bidder's goods or services
- \* Reputation of bidder and of bidder goods and
- (b) The City reserves the right to accept any item or group of items of this Bid, unless the Bidder qualifies his Bid by specific limitation. Reference section 5(a) 3 above.
- (c) A written award of acceptance mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful Bidder will then be followed up with a contract/service agreement for review by the City's legal team, if not otherwise specified within.
- (d) Prices must be quoted "F.O.B. Destination (Killeen) with all transportation charges prepaid," unless otherwise specified in the Bid.
- (e) If identical Bids are received from two or more bidders and those Bids are the lowest and best Bid, the tie shall be broken in accordance with provisions in Section 271.901 of the <u>Texas Local</u> Government Code.
- (f) As stated in Section 271.905 of the <u>Texas Local Government Code</u>, "In purchasing under this title any real property or personal property that is not affixed to real property, if a local government receives one or more competitive sealed Bid from a bidder whose principal place of business is in the local government and whose Bid is within three percent of the lowest Bid price received by the local government from a bidder who is not a resident of the municipality, the local government may enter into a contract with: (1) the lowest bidder; or (2) the bidder whose principal place of business is in the local government if the governing body of the local government determines, in writing, that the local bidder offers the local government the best combination of contract price and additional economic development opportunities for the local government created by the contract award, including the employment of residents of the local government and increased tax revenues to the local government."
- (g) As stated in Section 271.9051(b) of the <u>Texas Local Government Code</u>, "In purchasing real property or personal property that is not affixed to real property, or services, if a municipality receives one or more competitive sealed Bid from a bidder whose principal place of business is in the municipality and whose Bid is within five percent of the lowest Bid price received by the municipality from a bidder who is not a resident of the municipality, the municipality may enter into a contract for an expenditure of less than \$100,000 or a contract for other purchases in an amount of less than \$500,000 with: (1) the lowest bidder; or (2) the bidder whose principal place of business is in the municipality if the governing body of the local government determines, in writing, that the local bidder offers the municipality the best combination of contract price and additional economic development opportunities for the municipality created by the contract award, including the employment of residents of the municipality and increased tax revenues to the municipality."

### 11. Ex Parte Communication

Please note that to ensure the proper and fair evaluation of a proposal, the City prohibits ex parte communication (e.g., unsolicited) initiated by the Proposer to a City Official or employee evaluating or considering the proposal prior to the time a formal decision has been made. Questions and other communication from proposers will be permissible with only the Director of Procurement and Contract Management until the time and the day specified as the deadline for questions. Any communication between Proposer and the City after the deadline for questions will be initiated by the appropriate City Official or employee in order to obtain information or clarification needed to develop a proper and accurate evaluation of the proposals. Participation in any ex parte communication, whether or not initiated by the

Proposer, may be grounds for disqualifying the offending proposer from consideration or award of the solicitation then in evaluation, or any future solicitation.

Additionally, neither the City of Killeen City Council nor City staff, except in the course of City-Sponsored inquiries, briefings, interviews, or presentations, shall initiate any contact with a Proposer or directly discuss or promote any proposal with any Proposers, including their agents and representatives.

### 12. Bid Protest

Any bidder wishing to file a protest concerning alleged improprieties with this solicitation must submit the protest in written format to the Purchasing Division within 5 business days after the specified time of the Bid opening. The formal written protest must identify the name of the bidder contesting the solicitation, the project name and number, and the specific grounds for the protest with all supporting documentation. A response to the protest will be prepared by Purchasing within 10 business days of receipt of the protest. All determinations made by the City are final.

### 13. Termination for Governmental Non-Appropriations

This contract is a commitment of the City's current revenues only. Should the terms of the Bid require payment of funds over more than the current fiscal year ending September 30, the following shall apply:

- (a) For each lease, City represents and warrants: that it has appropriated and budgeted the necessary fund to make all rent payments required pursuant to such lease for the remainder of the fiscal year in which the payment term commences; and that it currently intends to make rent payments for the full lease term as scheduled in the applicable payment schedule if funds are appropriated for the rent payment in each succeeding fiscal year by its governing body. Without contractually committing itself to do so, City reasonably believes that monies in an amount sufficient to make all rent payments can and will lawfully be appropriated; therefore, City agrees to budget requests to include the rent payments payable during each fiscal year in the budget requests presented to City's governing body for each fiscal year; provided, that City's governing body retains authority to approve or reject any such budget request. All rent payments shall be payable out of the general funds of City or out of other funds legally appropriated therefore. Lessor agrees that no lease will be a general obligation of City and no lease shall constitute a pledge of either the full faith and credit of City or the taxing power of City.
- (b) If City's governing body fails to appropriate sufficient funds in any fiscal year for rent property or other payments due under a lease and if other funds are not legally appropriated for such payment, then a non-appropriation event shall be deemed to have occurred. If a non-appropriation event occurs, then: (1) City shall give lessor immediate notice of such non-appropriation event and provide written evidence of such failure by City's governing body; (2) on the return date, City shall return to Lessor all of the equipment covered by the affected lease, at City's sole expense; (3) the affected lease shall terminate on the return date without penalty to City; (4) return date means the last day of the fiscal year for which appropriations were made for the rent payments due under a lease.

### 14. Termination of Contract

This contract shall remain in effect until the contract expires, delivery/completion and acceptance of products and/or performance of services ordered or until terminated by either party with a thirty (30) day written notice prior to any cancellation. All bidders must state therein the reasons for such cancellation. City reserves the right to award a cancelled contract to next best offeror as it deems to be in the best interest of the City.

### 15. Assurance of Compliance

For Equal Employment Opportunity and Small and/or Minority Business Enterprise Requirements the bidder agrees that if this Bid is accepted, he/she will not engage in employment practices which have the effect of discriminating against employees or prospective employees because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, handicap, or political belief or affiliation.

### 16. Conflict of Interest Disclosure Ouestionnaire

The Bidder agrees that if a member of the City Council a Councilmember's close relative or any officer or employee of the City has a financial interest, direct or indirect, or by reason of ownership of stock in any corporation, in any contract with the City, or be financially interested, directly or indirectly, in the sale to the City any land, materials, supplies or services except on behalf of the City, as an officer or employee, the official shall file before a vote or decision on any matter involving the business entity or the real property, an affidavit stating the nature and extent of the interest and shall abstain from further participation in the matter if:

- (a) in the case of a substantial interest in a business entity the action on the matter will have a special economic effect on the business entity that is distinguishable from the effect on the public; or
- (b) in the case of a substantial interest in real property, it is reasonably foreseeable that an action on the matter will have a special economic effect on the value of the property, distinguishable from its effect on the public.

Chapter 176 of the Texas Local Government Code mandates the public disclosure of certain information concerning persons doing business or seeking to do business with the City of Killeen, including affiliations and business and financial relationships such persons may have with the City of Killeen. ### 17. Gratuities

It shall be a breach of ethics to offer, give, or agree to give any employee of the City or for any employee of the City to solicit or accept from another person, a gratuity or an offer of employment in connection with any decision regarding any part of a program requirement, proposal, or purchase request pending before the City.

### 18. Kickbacks

It shall be a breach of ethics for any payment, gratuity, or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor for any contract for the City, or any person associated therewith, as an inducement for the award of a subcontract or order.

### 19. Venue for Legal Action

This agreement shall be governed and construed according to the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for purposes of any and all lawsuits, causes of actions, claims or disputes shall be in Bell County, Texas.

### 20. Conflicts in Terms and Conditions for Bids
