

Background

- City Council adopted Capital Project Policies on April 10, 2018, requiring a 5-year CIP to be produced annually.
- Proposed 5-year CIP is developed based on master plans and departmental needs.
- □ This presentation provides an overview of recommended new projects and ongoing projects needing additional funding in FY 2026.
- Eligible projects include equipment, vehicles, facilities, and infrastructure with a value exceeding \$100,000.
- Project categories: Aviation, Facilities, Parks & Recreation, Drainage, Transportation, Water & Sewer, Technology, Vehicles & Equipment, Other Projects, and Fiscally Constrained.

Project Funding Sources

Funding sources considered fall into one of the following categories:
