BY-LAWS AND MEMBERSHIP STRUCTURE

Background

- City Council created the Crime Solutions Committee March 2021(RS-21-033) and approved Memorandum of Agreement for the committee May 2021(RS-21-065)
 - Committee was originally established with thirteen (13) places as follows
 - City of Killeen councilmember
 - Three (3) City of Killeen community members
 - City of Harker Heights councilmember
 - One (1) Harker Heights community member
 - Bell County Commissioner
 - Killeen ISD Representative
 - Fort Cavazos Representative
 - Regional Business Leader
 - Youth Advocate Group Representative
 - Faith-Based Organization Representative
 - Civic-Based Organization Representative

Background

- City of Harker Heights and Killeen ISD are not participating on the committee as members at this time
- At the committee's January 31, 2024 meeting the committee members approved by-laws and recommended a new twelve (12) member and one (1) ad-hoc member structure as follows:
 - City of Killeen Councilmember
 - One (1) community member from each of the City of Killeen Council Districts (appointed by each District Councilmember)
 - One (1) At-Large community member from withing the Killeen City limits or ETJ (appointed by the entire City Council)
 - Bell County Representative
 - Fort Cavazos Representative
 - City of Killeen Business Representative (appointed by the entire City Council)
 - Faith-based Organization Representative (appointed by the entire City Council)
 - Youth Organization Representative (appointed by the entire City Council)
 - Youth Advisory Council Representative (Ad-hoc non-voting member)
