

LETTER OF AGREEMENT WITH 120 WATER FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025

Background and Findings

- On October 2, 2024, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the final Lead and Copper Rule Improvements (LCRI) requiring water systems to identify and replace lead pipes within 10 years.
- In FY24, the City of Killeen partnered with 120Water to complete the EPA mandated Lead Service Line Inventory (LSLI) and to assist with customer notifications.
 - All Public Water Systems (PWS) were required to submit an inventory by October 16, 2024.
 - The City of Killeen submitted its completed inventory to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) on October 15, 2024.

- The city confirmed no lead service lines are in use within the water distribution system on the CITY SIDE.
 - EPA requires notification to customers within 30 days of completion of the LSLI that they have a galvanized, lead, or unidentified service line that requires replacement.
 - 2,512 residents currently have galvanized, lead, or unidentified service line requiring replacement.
 - The PWS is required to repeat this notification on an annual basis until the lines have been replaced.

Recommendation

□ Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute a Letter of Agreement with 120Water for the 2025 Lead and Copper Sampling event, required school and childcare facility sampling, and all communication requirements, in the amount of \$59,247.42 and authorize City Manager, or his designee, to execute any and all change orders within the amounts set by the State and Local law.
