MEET AND CONFER **AGREEMENT**

- In May 2022, the City Council ratified its first Meet and Confer Agreement with the Killeen Police Employee Association FOP Lodge 32.
- In May 2023, the City Council ratified revisions to the agreement.
- The main issue addressed in the current agreement is the promotional process.
 - Applicable statutes, ordinances, local orders, and civil service rules apply to an issue not governed by the Meet and Confer Agreement.

Proposed Changes

- Two year term
- Lateral Hire Process
- Positive Discipline
- Supervisor Intervention rather than formal discipline for minor violations
- Elimination of geographical distance requirements for KPD officers
- Supervisors may take home assigned vehicles if the officer lives within 30 miles of city limits

- In order for the Meet and Confer Agreement to be binding and enforceable:
 - The City Council must ratify the agreement by majority vote.
 - The police association must ratify
 - KPEA-FOP 32 conducted an election and the agreement was ratified.
