Background

- Adopted in August 2022, the Killeen 2040 Comprehensive Plan will continue to shape the growth and evolution of Killeen over the next two decades in ways that reflect how the community wants to grow.
- Community input during the Comprehensive Plan public participation process revealed that Killeen residents want their city to keep growing, but not at the expense of quality of life. Instead, they want growth to contribute to moving our city forward – especially on the six Big Ideas.

- Hosted Touchdown in Downtown on September 9th to celebrate the one-year anniversary of the Comprehensive Plan implementation.

Killeen 2040 – Major Accomplishments

- Adopted a homeless and Mental Health Strategic Plan
- Updated street construction standards, site design and architectural standards, and reduced the standard pavement width for all street classifications.
- Revived the TIRZ #2 to invest over \$160 Million over the next 25 years to leverage an estimated \$1 billion in private investments to expand business park and revitalize North Killeen and Downtown.
- □ Increased occupancy in Downtown from 58% to 80%.
