# **Approval of Agenda**

Motion was made by Mayor Pro-Tem Moore to approve the agenda as written. Motion seconded by Councilmember Rivera. The motion carried unanimously.

### Minutes

Motion was made by Councilmember Kilpatrick to approve the minutes of the March 28th Regular City Council Meeting. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

# **Resolutions**

**RS-17-038** Consider a memorandum/resolution authorizing the lease with purchase option of a wheel loader and compact excavator for the Drainage Maintenance division.

**Staff comments:** Frank Tydlacka

The Drainage Maintenance division leases a track loader to be used in routine operations, minor construction projects and upkeep of the approximate 457 acres of drainage channels throughout the city. It was found necessary to return that unit when the lease expired in June 2016 and replace it with a down-sized machine that would be more capable in confined areas. Staff recommends the procurement of the wheel loader and compact excavator from Romco Equipment Co., through the TASB BuyBoard, with financing provided by Bancorp South Equipment Finance, on a three-year lease of \$3,566.49 per month, and that the City Manager or designee is authorized to approve the purchase of the equipment at the end of the three-year lease period for \$76,771.20 if the purchase is approved in the FY20 budget, and that the City Manager or designee is expressly authorized to execute any and all change orders within the amounts set by state and local law.

Motion was made by Councilmember Fleming to approve RS-17-038. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

**RS-17-039** Consider a memorandum/resolution authorizing the issuance of a permit to American Fireworks for the discharge of fireworks as part of the Celebrate Killeen Festival.

**Staff comments:** Brett Williams

The Celebrate Killeen Committee desires to include a fireworks display at the annual event

for a third consecutive year. American Fireworks has been identified as a service provider for the display. The proposed plan is to conduct the fireworks display on Saturday, April 29, 2017, at 9:30 p.m. at the conclusion of the festival's outdoor movie showing, signifying the festival's end. Staff recommends that City Council authorize the issuance of a permit to discharge fireworks to American Fireworks as part of the City's annual Celebrate Killeen Festival at the Killeen Community Center Complex.

Motion was made by Councilmember Kilpatrick to approve RS-17-039. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Rivera. Motion carried unanimously.

**RS-17-041** Consider a memorandum/resolution authorizing the Texas Department of Transportation-Aviation Division to act as the Airport Agent for the administration of the Skylark Field T-Hangar Project.

**Staff comments:** Jim Livingston

Staff recommends City Council approve a resolution for TxDOT-Aviation to act as the Airport Agent for the disbursement of NPE funds and administration of the design and construction of a Skylark Field T-hangar project and for the purpose of applying for, receiving and disbursing all federal and state funds for this project and for the administration of contracts necessary for the initiation of the work; and authorize the City Manager to execute any and all required documents including any and all amendments within the amounts set by state and local law.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro-Tem Moore to approve RS-17-041. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Fleming. Motion carried unanimously.

**RS-17-042** Consider a memorandum/resolution to suspend the April 21, 2017, effective date of Oncor Electric Delivery Company's requested rate change and approving cooperation with the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor.

**Staff comments:** Kathy Davis

State law permits cities to suspend a rate change for ninety (90) days after the rates would otherwise be effective for any legitimate purpose. By suspending the effective date, the Steering Committee will have adequate time to study and investigate the application, as well as negotiate rates. Staff recommends approval of the attached resolution suspending the effective date of Oncor's rate request and authorizing the city's continued cooperation with the Steering Committee.

Motion was made by Councilmember Rivera to approve RS-17-042 resolution suspending the effective date for 90 days. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Johnson. Motion carried unanimously.

**RS-17-043** Consider a memorandum/resolution adopting a city council policy establishing the procedure for appointments to citizen boards, commissions and committees.

The draft policy addresses the timeframe for making appointments, the process for reviewing applications, the duties of appointment subcommittees and the full council, term limits and criteria for appointment.

The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended disapproval of the applicant's request for an amendment to the Future Land Use Map from 'General Commercial' (GC) to 'Multi-Family Residential' (MFR) by a vote of 4 to 1. The four commissioners voting for disapproval decided that the current FLUM designation is appropriate for the area, and changing it would lead to development that would increase traffic in the area. During

the Planning and Zoning Commission's public hearing on this matter, Rebecca Woodul spoke in opposition to the FLUM change.

Mayor Segarra opened the public hearing.

James Woodul, 4505 Trimmier Rd - spoke against the rezoning.

Martin Holland, 4509 Trimmier Rd - concerned about adding traffic and additional noise in the area. Spoke against the request.

Pedro Quintero, 415 E. Ave D. - spoke in favor of request and assured a TIA (Traffic Impact Assessment) would be done.

With no one else appearing the public hearing was closed.

Motion was made by Councilmember Kilpatrick to approve PH-17-023A. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Rivera.

The four Commissioners voting for disapproval shared concerns regarding the potential for increased traffic as a result of the proposed multifamily residential project. The staff notified ten (10) surrounding property owners regarding this request and received one protest. Since the zoning request was recommended for disapproval, it will require a favorable vote of three-fourths (3/4) of all the members of the City Council for approval.

Mayor Segarra opened the public hearing.

James Woodul, 4505 Trimmier Rd - appalled at the city councils action to approve the amendment to the FLUM and feels the Council doesn't care about what citizens have to say.

Pedro Quintero, 415 E. Ave D - ask council to favor the zoning request.

Kelly Garrett, 7801 Jack Benny, Greenville, Texas (Developer) - thanked the Council for their approval and assured management would be on site.

With no one appearing the public hearing was closed.

Motion was made by Councilmember Rivera to approve PH-17-023B. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Okray. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Segarra opened the public hearing.

Ortiz Alberto, 4501 Chelsea Dr. - concerned about safety for kids getting on and off the school bus by putting a gate in as designed.

Pedro Quintero, 415 E. Ave D (owner representative) - spoke in favor of request.

With no one else appearing the public hearing was closed.

Councilmember Fleming made a motion to postpone this item until staff can bring back more information on this project to the council. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Kilpatrick. Motion carried 4 to 3 with Councilmember Johnson, Mayor Pro-Tem Moore, and Councilmember Okray opposing.

Councilmember Okray stated for the record that he believes consideration of this request is in order according to city ordinance and that Council is delaying only because of one item, School District comments. Councilmember Okray believes the Council is responsible to make considerations in accordance with city ordinance.

SUBJECT: Declaring a Vacancy on the Senior Citizens Advisory Board

# **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

The City of Killeen makes annual appointments to boards, commissions, and committees in September of each year and throughout the year as vacancies occur. Persons appointed to city boards, commissions or committees can be effective members only if they attend the groups' meetings regularly.

Sec.2-118 of the City of Killeen Code of Ordinances provides that, in the case of excessive absences, a board, commission or committee member can be removed from office. Missing three (3) consecutive meetings or more than twenty-five (25) percent of the meetings in a twelve-month period where the board, commission or committee meets more than four (4) times per year shall constitute excessive absences. Section 2-118 also lays out the process for declaring a position vacant due to excessive absences. Immediately after missing the requisite number of meetings, the secretary shall notify the president or chair in writing, who then notifies the city manager's office with recommendations in writing. The city manager then places the matter on the next available city council meeting agenda for consideration. At that meeting, the council may declare the position vacant.

The President of the Senior Citizens Advisory Board has notified the city manager's office that Mrs. Katherine Gordon has missed 3 consecutive unexcused meetings without contacting a city staff member or Board member of the Senior Citizens Advisory Board. The Senior Citizens Advisory Board President requests that the position be declared vacant

# **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

The City's depository bank, BBVA Compass, provides a Spend Net Payables commercial card program which is a state-of-the-art tool that uses virtual cards to deliver payments to City vendors without the need for them to log into a website. Spend Net Payables works with the City's accounts payable system to send payments to vendors electronically with a virtual account number.

Spend Net Payables will assist the City in four areas:

- 1. Working capital management Method of payment can be a crucial part of price negotiations with suppliers. Spend Net Payables will assist with optimizing cash flow, reducing transaction costs, and improving resource allocation.
- 2. New revenue streams BBVA works with the City to enroll suppliers into the program to maximize rebate and savings potential.
- 3. Improved processes BBVA allows the City to access meaningful information quickly while providing the flexibility and control needed to manage the payment program effectively.
- 4. Risk management BBVA provides tools that offer tighter controls and increased transparency which will help the City improve compliance, streamline audits, and reduce fraud/misuse.

BBVA Compass and staff identified over \$5 million in annual payments to vendors that accept commercial card payments. This amount represents only payments to vendors that exceed \$5,000 per year. If these payments were made through the Spend Net Payables program, the City would have received an estimated rebate of \$75,000. To get started, the City needs to establish a line of credit. BBVA Compass has agreed to put in place a \$1 million line of credit to facilitate the program.

# **THE ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:**

- 1. Leverage technology and utilize the BBVA Compass Spend Net Payables commercial card program.
- 2. Utilize the CitiBank commercial card program. CitiBank indicated that they do not have a program suitable for the city's purposes.
- 3. Continue to process, print, and mail checks manually.

# Which alternative is recommended? Why?

Alternative 1 is recommended. This program will provide rebates to the City, improve reporting, enhance controls over cash, and reduce check processing costs.

### **CONFORMITY TO CITY POLICY:**

Debt Management Policy Section VI(A). Where their use is judged to be prudent and advantageous to the City, the City has the power to enter into agreements with commercial banks or other financial entities for purposes of acquiring lines or letters of credit that shall provide the City with access to credit under terms and conditions as specified in such agreements. Before entering into any such agreements, takeout financing for such lines or letters of credit must be planned for and determined to be feasible by the Director of Finance. Any agreements with financial institutions for the acquisition of lines or letters of credit shall be approved by the City Council.

The Spend Net Payables commercial card program will not result in an outflow of cash. All entities that accept credit cards pay merchant fees to their credit card processor. BBVA Compass will rebate a portion of the merchant fees collected to the City.

# **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The City Council has identified a need to adequately plan for major capital outlay and water and sewer infrastructure improvements programs. This process is evident in the recently completed Water and Sewer Master Plan which calls for the consideration of \$45 million in water and sewer improvements projects. The issuance of debt to finance these and other capital improvement projects has become an increasingly important component of the City's financial management strategy. The City Council needs to adopt a formal Debt Management Policy to establish guidelines for the planning, implementation, and evaluation of the debt program and the City's ability to service such debt. The Debt Management Policy is designed to provide guidance to all participants in the capital improvement process. As project request are evaluated, and funding decisions are considered, the acceptable level of debt issuance, and tax and fee increases should be clearly indicated in the City's debt management policies.

# **DISCUSSION/CONCLUSION**

The staff has prepared a Debt Management Policy document for consideration by the City Council. This document will serve as a policy directive to the staff in matters which involve the issuance of debt. The policy addresses several areas:

- 1) The acceptable levels of debt which the City may incur. This criterion is evaluated in terms of the maximum amount of debt allowed by the City Charter and State Law and also by the acceptable level of debt that can be incurred without jeopardizing the City's credit ratings.
- 2) The purpose for which debt will be issued and the appropriate type of debt to be issued.
- 3) Guidelines for issuance of short-term debt and evaluation of the debt service fund using recognized criteria and performance measurement standards.

- 4) Use of tax-supported, general obligation bonds versus self-supporting, revenue bonds.
- 5) The evaluation of "pay-as-you-go" financing versus debt financing.
- 6) Use of fixed versus variable rate debt; and the structure of each type of debt issued.
- 7) Debt maturity schedules.
- 8) Selection of Financial Consultants, Legal Bond Counsel, Bond Underwriters, Paying Agents, and other service providers.
- 9) Use of bond credit rating agencies.
- 10) Other matters which are relevant to the City's credit standing.

# RECOMMENDATION

The staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached Debt Policy. The adoption of this policy will assist the City Council in evaluating the impact of each funding decision on the City's debt position and credit quality. In addition, the policy will enable the City Council to identify and address potential credit concerns before they are raised by the rating agencies or other interested parties.

# CITY OF KILLEEN, TEXAS DEBT MANAGEMENT POLICY

# I. SELECTION OF FINANCE CONSULTANTS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS

The City's Director of Finance shall be responsible for establishing a solicitation and selection process for securing professional services that are required to develop and implement the City's debt program. Goals of the solicitation and selection process shall include encouraging participation from qualified service providers, both local and national, and securing services at competitive prices.

- **A. Bond Counsel.** As part of the responsibility to oversee and coordinate the debt management policy, the Director of Finance shall make recommendations to the City Council regarding the selection of Bond Counsel to be employed and the duration of the employment for individual or series of financing. The solicitation and selection process for such services will comply with State requirements for Professional, Technical, and Expert Services.
- **B.** <u>Underwriters.</u> The Director of Finance shall solicit proposals for underwriting services for all debt issued in a negotiated or private placement sale mode. The solicitation process used for these services shall comply fully with State requirements for Professional, Technical, and Expert Services. The selection of underwriters may be for an individual or series of financing or specified time period.
- **C.** <u>Financial Advisor.</u> The Director of Finance shall make a recommendation to the City Council regarding the selection of financial advisors to be employed and the duration of such employment. The solicitation and selection process for such services will comply with State requirements for Professional, Technical, and Expert Services. The time period for employment may relate to an individual or a series of financing, or for a specified period of time.
- **D.** Paying Agent. The Director of Finance shall solicit periodically for paying agent services from qualified commercial and trustee banks. The cost of providing such services shall be used by the Finance Director, along with other qualitative measurements, in developing a Paying Agent recommendation to City Council, along with the term of such agreement.
- **E.** Other Service Providers. The Director of Finance shall periodically solicit for other service providers (escrow agents, verification agents, trustees, etc.). The cost of providing such services shall be used by the Finance Director in developing a recommendation to City Council, along with the terms of such agreement.

### II. COMPREHENSIVE CAPITAL PLANNING AND FINANCING SYSTEM

**A.** Capital Planning and Financing System. The City shall develop a capital planning and financing system for use in preparing a multi-year Capital Improvement Plan for consideration by the City Council as part of the City's budget process. The City Manager shall prepare recommendations to the City Council for projects to be included in a multi-year capital improvements plan. This plan shall be for the coming three fiscal years and shall be updated periodically. The Plan shall contain a comprehensive description of the sources of funds and the timing of capital projects for future operating and capital budgets, effect of the projects on future debt sales, debt outstanding, and debt service requirements, and the impact on future debt burdens and current revenue requirements.

In this latter regard, the Plan shall, analyze the conformance of the planned financing with policy targets regarding the (1) magnitude and composition of the City's indebtness, and (2) the economic and fiscal resources of the City to bear such indebtness over the next three years. Affordability impacts of the Plan shall be evaluated in consultation with the various City departments.

- **B.** <u>Debt Calendar and Financing Priorities.</u> It shall be the responsibility of the Director of Finance, within the context of the Capital Improvement Plan, to oversee and coordinate the timing, process of issuance, and marketing of the City's borrowing and capital funding activities required in support of the Plan. In this capacity, the Finance Director shall make recommendations to the City Council regarding necessary and desirable actions and shall keep it informed through regular an special reports as to the progress and results of current-year activities under the Plan.
- C. <u>Maintenance, Replacement and Renewal</u>. Consistent with its philosophy of keeping its capital facilities and infrastructure systems in good repair and to maximize the capital stock's useful life, the City should set aside sufficient current revenues to finance ongoing maintenance needs and to provide reserves for periodic replacement and renewal.
- **D.** <u>Debt Authorization</u>. No City debt issued for the purpose of funding capital projects shall be authorized by the City Council unless it has been included in a report of the impact of the contemplated borrowing on the existing Capital Improvement Plan and recommendations as to the financing arrangements from the Finance Director.

### III. LIMITATIONS ON CITY INDEBTNESS

- A. Authority for the issuance and sale of Bonds: The City has the authority to issue bonds and time warrants under Article VI sections 66 and 67 of the City Charter. These sections state that the City of Killeen shall have the right and power to issue its general obligation bonds on the full faith and credit of the City, payable from ad valorem taxes not to exceed the maximum rate permitted by the Texas Constitution, for the purpose of providing permanent public improvements or for any other public purpose. The City shall have the right and power to issue its revenue bonds payable from the revenues of any municipally owned utility or utilities, and may secure such revenue bonds by a mortgage or deed of trust on the physical properties of such utility or utilities. The City also shall have the right and power to issue interest bearing time warrants pursuant to Article 2368a, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statues. All bonds and warrants of the City of Killeen shall be issued pursuant to the procedures and requirements established by the general laws of the State of Texas.
- **B.** Target Limitations on Tax General Obligation Indebtness. The City shall as a matter of policy, conduct its finances so that the amount of direct, tax support general obligation debt service payments outstanding at any time that is subject to approval by the voters (excluding long-term, non-self supporting leases) does not exceed 2.5% of the City's taxable assessed valuation.
- C. <u>Target Limitations on Lease-Purchase Financing of Equipment and Furnishings</u>. The City may enter into short-term lease purchase obligations to finance the acquisition of capital equipment and furnishings with estimated useful lives of less than ten years.
- **D.** <u>Limitations on General Fund Loan Guarantees and Credit Support.</u> As part of the City's financing activities, General Fund resources may be used to proved credit support or loan guarantees for public or private developments that meet high priority City needs. Before such General Fund commitments are made, specific policy goals and objectives that determine the nature and type of projects qualifying for such support, and specific limitations to be placed on the maximum amount of General Fund resources pledged to such projects shall be developed.

The City Manager shall be responsible for coordinating the development of such policies and goals, which shall not take effect until approved by the City Council. General Fund loan guarantees shall be subject to the overall debt limitations set for in B above.

Recognizing the limited capacity of the City's General Fund to support both ongoing operating programs and secure long-term debt obligations, use of General Fund resources to secure obligations must first be approved by the City Council. Key factors that will be considered in determining whether or not the General Fund should be used to secure a particular debt obligation will include the following:

- 1. Demonstration of underlying self-support, thus limiting potential General Fund financial exposure.
- 2. Use of General Fund support as a transition to a fully stand alone credit structure, where interim use of the General Fund credit support reduces borrowing costs and provides a credit history for new or hard to establish credits.
- 3. General Fund support is determined by the City Council to be in the City's overall best interest.
- E. <u>Target Limitations on the Issuance of Revenue-Secured Debt Obligations</u>. The City shall seek to finance the capital needs of its revenue producing enterprise activities through the issuance of revenue-secured debt obligations. Prior to issuing revenue-secured debt obligations, the Finance Director, will develop financial plans and projections showing the feasibility of the planned financing, required rates and charges needed to support the planned financing, and the impact of the planned financing on ratepayers, property owners and other affected parties.

# IV. STRUCTURE AND TERM OF CITY INDEBTEDNESS

- **A.** Rapidity of Debt Repayment. Generally, borrowings by the City should be of a duration that does not exceed the economic life of the improvement that it finances and where feasible should be shorter than the projected economic life. Moreover, to the extent possible, the City should design the repayment of debt so as to recapture its credit capacity for future use.
- **B.** <u>Use of Variable-Rate Securities.</u> When appropriate, the City may choose to issue securities that pay a rate of interest that varies according to a pre-determined formula or results from a periodic remarketing of the securities. The decision to issue such securities must be reviewed and approved by the City Manager and the Director of Finance, in consultation with the City Financial Advisors, before the City Council is requested to approved their issuance.
- C. <u>Pledge of Restricted Funds to Secure Debt.</u> The City has the power to make an irrevocable pledge of a security interest in an account created exclusively for the security of holders of City obligations. Before such funds are used to secure a prospective financing, policies regarding the use of such restricted funds shall be developed by the Director of Finance to ensure that the use of such funds to secure bonds does not violate restrictions on such funds and that underlying program commitments can be maintained in addition to meeting debt service obligations on debt secured by the restricted funds. These policies shall be presented as recommendations to Council prior to or at the time issuance of the secured debt is to be authorized.

**D.** <u>Use of Subordinate Lien Obligations.</u> Creation of the subordinate lien financing structure, if appropriate, shall be based on the overall financing needs of the City, expected credit ratings, relative cost of a subordinate lien structure, and impacts on the City. The Director of Finance shall present the results of this review in the form of a recommendation to Council for consideration prior to or at the time such bonds are being authorized.

### V. METHOD OF SALE

- **A.** Competitive Sale. The City, as a mater of policy, shall seek to issue its debt obligations in a competitive sale unless it is determined that such a sale method will not produce the best results for the City. In such instances where the City in a competitive bidding for its debt securities (whether general obligation or non-general obligation debt) deems the bids as unsatisfactory or does not receive bids, it may, at the election of the City Council, enter into negotiation for the sale of the securities.
- **B.** Negotiated Sales. The City may elect to sell its debt obligations through a negotiated sale. Such determination may be made on an issue by issue basis, for a series of issues, or for part or all of a specific financing program. Selection of the underwriting team shall be made pursuant to selection procedures set forth in these Debt Policies.
- **C.** <u>Private Placement.</u> The City may elect to sell its debt obligations through private placement or limited public offering. Selection of the placement agent shall be subject to the approval of City Council.
- **D.** Official Bid Form. The City shall design an official bid form to be made part of the each official notice of sale published in conjunction with the sale of debt securities in a competitive sale by the City.

### VI. SHORT-TERM DEBT AND INTERIM FINANCING

- **A.** <u>Lines and Letters of Credit.</u> Where their use is judged to be prudent and advantageous to the City, the City has the power to enter into agreements with commercial banks or other financial entities for purposes of acquiring lines or letters of credit that shall provide the City with access to credit under terms and conditions as specified in such agreements. Before entering into any such agreements, takeout financing for such lines or letters of credit must be planned for and determined to be feasible by the Director of Finance. Any agreements with financial institutions for the acquisition of lines or letters of credit shall be approved by the City Council.
- **B.** Bond Anticipation Notes. Where their use is judged to be prudent and advantageous to the City, the City may choose to issue Bond Anticipation Notes as a source of interim construction financing. Before issuing such notes, takeout financing for such notes must be planned for and determined to be feasible by the Director of Finance. Bond Anticipation Notes may be sold in either a competitive or negotiated sale, subject to authorization and approval by the City Council.
- **C.** Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes. Where their use is judged to be prudent and advantageous to the City, the City may choose to issue Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes to fund internal working capital cashflow needs. Before issuing such notes, cashflow projections will be prepared by the Director of Finance. Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes may be sold in either a competitive or negotiated sale, subject to authorization and approval by the City Council.

### VII. REFUNDING OF CITY INDEBTNESS

- **A.** <u>Debt Service Savings Advance Refundings.</u> The City may issue advance refunding bonds (as defined for federal tax law purposes) when advantageous, legally permissible, prudent, and net present value savings, expressed as a percentage of the par amount of the refunding bonds, indicates that a advance refunding is in the City's overall best financial interests.
- **B.** <u>Debt Service Savings Current Refundings.</u> The City may issue current refunding bonds (as defined for federal tax law purposes) when advantageous, legally permissible, prudent, and net present value savings are significant.
- **C.** Restructuring of Debt. The City may choose to refund outstanding indebtness when existing bond convents or other financial structures impinge on prudent and sound financial management. Savings requirements for current or advance refundings undertaken to restructure debt may be waived by the City Council upon a finding that such a restructuring is in the City's overall best financial interests.
- **D.** Open Market Purchase of City Securities. The city may choose to defease its outstanding indebtness through purchases of its securities on the open market when market conditions make such an option financially feasible. The Director of Finance shall be responsible for developing procedures for executing open market purchases and the savings objectives to be achieved by undertaking such actions.

### VIII. USE OF CREDIT ENHANCEMENT

The City shall seek to use credit enhancement (letters of credit, bond insurance, surety bonds, etc.) when such credit enhancement proves cost-effective. Selection of credit enhancement providers shall be subject to a review process developed by the Director of Finance. Credit enhancement may be used to improve or establish a credit rating on a City debt obligation even is such enhancement is not cost effective if, in the opinion of the Director of Finance, the use of such credit enhancement meets the City's debt financing goals and objectives.

# IX. REBATE REPORTING AND COVENANT COMPLIANCE

The Director of Finance shall establish a system of record keeping and reporting to meet the arbitrage rebate compliance requirements of the federal tax code. This effort shall include tracking investment earnings on bond proceeds, calculating rebate payments in compliance with tax law, and remitting any rebatable earnings to the federal government in a timely manner in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the City's outstanding debt issues. Additionally, general financial reporting and certification requirements embodied in bond covenants shall be monitored to ensure that all covenants are complied with.

### X. CONDUCT FINANCING

The City may sponsor conduit financing for those activities (i.e., economic development, housing, health facilities, etc.) that have a general public purpose and are consistent with the City's overall service and policy objectives. All conduit financing must insulate the City completely from any credit risk or exposure and must be approved by the City Council for authorization and implementation.

### XI. FINANCING PROPOSALS

Any capital financing proposal made to any City department, division, or Commission involving a pledge or other extension of the City's credit through the sale of securities, execution of loans or leases, or making of guarantees or otherwise involving directly or indirectly the lending or pledging of the City's credit shall be referred to the Director of Finance, who in a timely manner shall be responsible for analyzing the proposal and submitting a recommendation on the proposal to the City Council for approval.

# XII. OTHER POLICIES AND REQUIREMENTS

**A.** Annual Audit of City. The annual audit of the City shall describe in detail all funds and fund balances established as part of any direct debt financing of the City. The audit may also contain a report detailing any material or rate covenants contained in any direct offering of the City and whether or not such covenants have been satisfied.

### XIII. CREDIT RATINGS

- **A.** Rating Agency Relationships. The Director of Finance shall be responsible for maintaining relationships with the rating agencies that currently assign ratings to the City's various debt obligations. This effort shall include providing periodic updates on the City's general financial condition along with coordinating meetings and presentations in conjunction with a new debt issuance.
- **B.** <u>Use of Rating Agencies.</u> The City Manager and the Director of Finance shall be responsible for determining whether or not a rating shall be requested on a particular financing, and which of the major rating agencies shall be asked to provide such a rating.
- **C.** <u>Minimum Long-Term Rating Requirements.</u> The City's minimum rating requirement for its direct, long-tern, debt obligations is a rating of "A" or higher. If such a debt obligation cannot meet this requirement based on its underlying credit strength, then credit enhancement shall be sought to ensure that the minimum rating is achieved. If credit enhancement is unavailable or is determined to be uneconomical, then the obligations may be issued without a rating, subject to prior approval by the City Council.

### XIV. ONGOING DISCLOSURE

The Director of Finance shall be responsible for providing ongoing disclosure information to established national information repositories and for maintaining compliance with disclosure standards promulgated by state and national regulatory bodies.

# **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

On March 14, 2017, Killeen City Council approved the competitive bid process to begin for the replacement of existing airwalls at the Killeen Civic and Conference Center. Specifications were developed and bids were advertised on March 19 and 26, 2017. Bids were opened and read aloud on April 4, 2017, at 3:15pm at Killeen City Hall-Council Chambers.

# **THE ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:**

# Which alternative is recommended? Why?

The current airwalls at the Killeen Civic and Conference Center are beyond refurbishing and will not provide the noise attenuation that is desired for a conference center operation. Purchasing new air walls with greater sound reduction is the best solution to maintain and potentially increase revenue at the conference center. Bookings are anticipated to increase with the new airwalls because noise will not be the primary factor when booking events that can be located next to each other in the facility.

# **CONFORMITY TO CITY POLICY:**

The competitive bid process is required per Local Government Code and Killeen City Charter.

# **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

What is the amount of the expenditure in the current fiscal year? For future years?

The following bids were received from two vendors: National Air Wall Sytems in the amount of \$371,170.00 and HUFCOR, Inc in the amount of \$248,500.00.

#### Is this a one-time or recurring expenditure?

The newly-purchased airwalls for this facility item are expected to last 10 to 15 years. With an ongoing maintenance program based on recommended industry standards, it is anticipated that the airwalls will last as noted.

#### Is this expenditure budgeted?

The purchase of new airwalls was not funded in the FY 17 budget. A budget amendment was approved on March 14, 2017.

#### If not, where will the money come from?

A budget amendment was approved by City Council on March 14, 2017, to fund the airwalls in the amount of \$260,000.00 from the 214- Special Revenue Fund - Hotel Motel Occupancy Tax Receipts.

#### Is there a sufficient amount in the budgeted line-item for this expenditure?

Yes, funding is now in account 214-0705-457-60-05 Buildings, available for this purchase and expenditure.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that City Council award competitive bid # 17-08 Operational Panel Partitions Wall Replacement for the Killeen Civic and Conference Center to HUFCOR, Inc., that the City Manager is authorized to execute the contract for purchase of said airwalls from HUFCOR, Inc. that he is further authorized to execute any and all change orders allowed by state and local law.

**SUBJECT:** Purchase using State Seizure funds

#### **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

State Law, under Chapter 59 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, authorizes the state to share forfeited property and cash seized during criminal investigations with the participating law enforcement agency. Shared funds are kept in separate accounts that are monitored, regulated, and controlled by the Chief Law Enforcement Officer. Shared funds allow local law enforcement to fund programs that expand crime fighting resources and enhance the enforcement abilities of the department above what is routinely accessible though the normal budget process. The governing body is required to be notified of budgeted expenditures from these accounts, and the municipality may not use expenditures to offset or decrease salaries, expenses, or allowances already budgeted as the result of the availability of these funds.

Typically, seizure funds are utilized to acquire equipment that enhances the policing operation of a department, increasing the ability to safely conduct investigations and ensure convictions. Expenditures are normally one-time procurements of equipment or temporary support of new, unbudgeted police operations. We have utilized these funds for programs such as police canines, specialized training, purchase of surveillance equipment, crime scene equipment, and advanced computer technology, and to pay off third-party liens on vehicles acquired through the seizure process.

The Police Department's Tactical Response Unit is in need of tactical helmets and hearing protection with integrated microphones. Over the past year the team completed an extensive review of entry procedures and techniques. That review resulted in changes in the techniques used by the entry team when serving search and arrest warrants. The change requires new headsets with hearing protection. In order to accommodate the headset and hearing protection, new tactical helmets need to be purchased. The items are safety equipment to protect hearing and facilitate communications of Tactical Response Unit Officers when making tactical entries. The total cost for the tactical entry helmets is \$9,000. The total cost for the microphones, hearing protection, and accessories is \$40,023.

The Tactical Response Unit needs a cargo box to be secured to the top of the rescue vehicle. The cargo box allows for storage of TRU equipment. The cargo box is designed specifically for this specific rescue vehicle. It is waterproof and will provide some ballistic shielding when open. The total cost of the item is \$3,700.

The Tactical Response Unit must be prepared for a biological and or chemical attack. This necessitates the purchase of air purifying respirators which will allow the team to operate in a high threat environment. The cost of 25 masks is \$27,720.

The Special Investigations Division detectives are not able to recover, in a forensically sound environment, many surveillance videos from local businesses and residences. This is primarily because of an incompatibility in recovery systems and many business employees or residents do not know how to download the videos. A Digital Video Recovery Examiner allows the detective to capture the video evidence in a forensically sound environment, without having to disable the business or homeowner's surveillance system. The cost of the DVR Examiner is \$2,700.

The Patrol Division has two night vision optical instruments that have exceeded the recommended manufacturer life expectancy; one is no longer repairable. The units are 15 years old and are no longer supported by manufactured warranty. The department deploys these devices in night patrol tactics to apprehend criminal elements. The Department will replace one of the devices at a cost of \$5,230.

Patrol Officers are the first responders in all traumatic incidents. The officers have limited capability when assisting emergency medical needs of citizens and fellow officers while waiting for emergency medical technicians to arrive. The department needs to purchase emergency medical trauma kits to provide to all patrol officers. The total cost for kits is \$16,117.

The Police Department's Organized Crime unit needs to upgrade the equipment that is used to recover data from cellular phones and devices that use micro memory cards. The cost of this system is \$9,100.

The 27<sup>th</sup> Judicial District Court has awarded a forfeiture seizure, 2010 Dodge Challenger, to the Killeen Police Department. The vehicle has a lien of \$868 that has to be paid before the vehicle can be titled and registered to the City of Killeen.

In compliance with Chapter 59.06, this memorandum is to provide notice to the governing body of the projected expenditure of funds from the police department's State Seizure account in the amount of \$114,458

#### **THE ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:**

- 1. Reprogram funds from the department's operations to cover the costs. Due to recent budget cuts, there are no excess funds available.
- 2. Use funds from the State Forfeiture Seizure account.
- 3. Program funds into the FY18 budget.

#### Which alternative is recommended? Why?

Utilizing the State Seizure fund is the best option, as it allows for major equipment purchases with the least fiscal impact. It also allows for the immediate purchase of crime fighting and lifesaving equipment in lieu of waiting until the next fiscal year.

#### **CONFORMITY TO CITY POLICY:**

These expenditures conform to the State law governing seizure accounts and current City of Killeen purchasing policy. The funds will be transferred into the appropriate equipment accounts based on the policy.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

#### What is the amount of the expenditure in the current fiscal year? For future years?

The total expenditure in the current fiscal year is \$114,458. Funds will be available after a budget amendment transfers them from the State Seizure account into the appropriate departmental accounts.

The future expenses will vary depending on the life and maintenance of the equipment.

The helmets have a life expectancy of five years; a replacement portion will be incorporated into the TRU equipment budget beginning FY20.

The hearing protection have a life expectancy of 8-10 years dependent upon wear and tear. The cargo box is a one-time purchase with no future anticipated cost.

The respirator masks have a life expectancy of 10 years dependent upon wear and tear.

The DVR Examiner is an annual subscription of \$2,700, which includes software updates.

The night vision optic device is a one-time purchase.

The medical kits are consumable items; however, replacement kits are not anticipated for three years. At that time, they would be replaced as used @ \$90 per kit.

The cell phone extraction device has an annual subscription for update of \$3,700.

#### Is this a one-time or recurring expenditure?

The electronics (DVR Examiner and Cell phone device) require annual software updates; therefore, \$6,400 would need to be planned in the annual department budget. Other items are one-time expenditures (night vision optics and cargo box). There are consumables items that will need to be replaced as used or when they exceed life expectancy (trauma kits, helmets, hearing protection, microphones, and respirator mask filters).

#### Is this expenditure budgeted?

The purchases of the items in this notification are not in the current budget.

#### If not, where will the money come from?

The funds needed to purchase these items are located in the State Forfeiture Seizure account and require a budget amendment to make them available to the department.

#### Is there a sufficient amount in the budgeted line-item for this expenditure?

The State Seizure funds are not in the budget. The current balance in this account is \$181,812. After the budget amendment of \$114,458 into the department equipment accounts, the remaining balance in the State Seizure account will be \$67,354.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Police Department recommends council acknowledge notification of intent to purchase the qualifying equipment.

**SUBJECT:** State Seizure Fund budget amendment

#### **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

Chapter 59 of the Code of Criminal Procedure authorizes the state to share forfeited property and cash seized during criminal investigations with the participating law enforcement agency. Shared funds are kept in separate accounts that are monitored, regulated, and controlled by the Chief Law Enforcement Officer. Shared funds allow local law enforcement to fund programs that expand crime fighting resources and enhance the enforcement abilities of the department above what is routinely accessible through the normal budget process. The governing body is required to be notified of budgeted expenditures from these accounts, but the municipality may not use expenditures to offset or decrease salaries, expenses, or allowances already budgeted as the result of the availability of these funds.

Typically, seizure funds are utilized to acquire equipment that enhances the policing operation of a department, increasing their ability to safely conduct investigations and ensure convictions. Expenditures are normally for a one-time procurement of equipment or temporary support of new, unbudgeted police operations. The Police Department has utilized these funds for programs such as police canines and specialized training, the purchase of surveillance equipment, crime scene equipment, advanced computer technology, and to pay off third-party liens on vehicles acquired through the seizure process.

#### **THE ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:**

- 1. Reprogram funding from the department's operational accounts. Due to recent budget cuts, there is no excess funding available.
- 2. Utilize funding available within the State Seizure account via a budget amendment.
- 3. Delay purchases until FY 2018.

#### Which alternative is recommended? Why?

Alternative 2 is recommended. Funding is currently available but unbudgeted within the State Seizure Fund.

#### **CONFORMITY TO CITY POLICY:**

City Charter Section 56. After the conclusion of public hearing, the Council may insert new items or may increase or decrease the items of the Budget, except items in proposed expenditures

fixed by law. Before inserting any additional item or increasing any item of appropriation, it must cause to be published a notice setting forth the nature of the proposed increases and fixing a place and time, not less than five days after publication, at which the Council will hold a public hearing thereon.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

#### What is the amount of the expenditure in the current fiscal year? For future years?

The total expenditure in FY 2017 is \$114,458. Future year costs include a subscription cost of \$6,400 for the DVR examiner and the cell phone extraction device.

#### Is this a one-time or recurring expenditure?

This is a one-time expenditure with the exception of the \$6,400 annual subscription cost.

#### Is this expenditure budgeted?

No.

#### If not, where will the money come from?

There is currently \$181,812 of unappropriated funding available within the State Seizure Fund which is restricted for law enforcement use.

#### Is there a sufficient amount in the budgeted line-item for this expenditure?

No.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Council approve this ordinance amending the FY 2017 Annual Budget and Plan of Municipal Services to provide funding for the purchase of equipment for the Police Department.

'GENERAL COMMERCIAL' (GC) TO 'GENERAL RESIDENTIAL' (GR)

#### **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

M.A. Hoard Construction Co. II submits this request to amend the Comprehensive Plan's Future Land Use Map (FLUM) to change a 'General Commercial' (GC) designated area to a 'General Residential' (GR) designated area for Lot 41, Block 1, Grover Park. The property is located at 6501 Vahrenkamp Drive, Killeen, Texas.

**Land Use Plan:** The property is designated as 'General Commercial' (GC) on the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) of the Comprehensive Plan.

**Plan Recommendation:** The 'General Commercial' (GC) designation includes a wide range of commercial, retail and service uses, at varying scales and intensities depending on the site.

If approved, the proposed revision to the property would result in a 'General Residential' designation on the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) of the Comprehensive Plan. The 'General Residential' character encourages detached residential dwellings as the primary focus, attached housing types subject to compatibility and open space standards (e.g. duplexes), planned developments with a mix of housing types subject to compatibility and open space standards, public/institutional, parks, and other public spaces. The characteristics of this designation include:

- Predominantly "R-1" zoning district with less openness and separation between dwellings compared to Suburban Residential areas
- Auto-oriented character that can be offset with architectural standards, landscaping, and limited uniform subdivision designs
- Neighborhood-scale commercial emerging over time for well-suited areas

#### THE ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:

#### Which alternative is recommended? Why?

The items below should be reviewed and addressed when a Future Land Use Map amendment is being considered:

- Scope of Amendment: Is the proposed map change limited to one or a few parcels, or would it affect a much larger area? The amendment would affect approximately 2.3 acres and should be considered a small scale amendment.
- Change in Circumstances: What specific conditions (e.g., population size and/or characteristics, area character and building form, property/structure conditions, infrastructure or public services, market factors including need for more land in a particular designation, etc.) have changed sufficiently to render the current map designation(s) inappropriate or out-of-date? The surrounding area has developed with a mixture of commercial uses and residential development of single-family, two family, and multifamily zoning.
- Consistency with Other Plans: In addition to the Comprehensive Plan, is the proposed map change consistent with the intent and policy direction of any applicable small area plans, utility or drainage plans, or other City plans? The proposed map change is not inconsistent with other City planning efforts (Water and Wastewater Master Plan, Thoroughfare Plan, Parks Master Plan).
- Adequate Information: Do City staff, the Planning and Zoning Commission, and/or City Council have enough and appropriate information to move ahead with a decision (e.g., utility capacity, potential traffic impacts, other public service implications, and resident/stakeholder concerns and input)? Staff has sufficient information regarding utility capacity and roadway level of service for this area.
- Stakeholder Input: What points, concerns, and insights have been raised by area residents, property owners, business owners, or others? With the exception of listing this action as a public hearing item on the Planning and Zoning Commission's agenda, there is no public notice requirement for this amendment action.

#### **CONFORMITY TO CITY POLICY:**

This FLUM amendment request conforms to the city's policy as detailed in the Comprehensive Plan.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

What is the amount of the expenditure in the current fiscal year? For future years?

The proposed FLUM amendment does not involve the expenditure of city funds.



Ricky Smith, 4608 Chelsea Drive and Adalberto Ortiz, 4501 Chelsea Drive, Killeen, Texas spoke in opposition.

With no one else requesting to speak, the public hearing was closed.

Vice Chair Dorroh motioned to recommend approval of the designation of the property from a 'General Commercial' designated area to a 'General Residential' designated area. Commissioner Purser seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-2. Commissioner McLaurin and Commissioner Peters were in opposition, they stated that they supported the surrounding property owner's opposition.

Chairman Frederick stated that this request will be forwarded to City Council with a recommendation to approve.





#### **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

M.A. Hoard Construction Co. II, LTD. submits this request to rezone Lot 41, Block 1, Grover Park, from "B-5" (Business District) to "R-3A" (Multifamily Apartment Residential District). The property is locally known as 6501 Vahrenkamp Drive, Killeen, Texas.

#### **District Descriptions:**

### A building or premises in an "R-3A" Multifamily Apartment Residential District shall be used only for the following purposes:

- (a) Uses. A building or premises in an "R-3A" Multifamily Apartment Residential District shall be used only for the following purposes:
- (1) Any use permitted in the "R-1" or "R-2" districts
- (2) Multifamily structures containing five (5) or more separate dwelling units, including large apartment complexes with high rise structures
- (3) Boarding and lodging houses
- (4) Fraternity or sorority houses
- (5) Licensed group or community homes housing six (6) or more persons
- (6) Dormitories for educational or employment purposes as a primary use
- (7) Any group housing activity not otherwise identified in another multifamily or business district
- (8) Accessory buildings and uses, customarily incident to the above uses and located on the same lot therewith, not involving the conduct of a business
- (b) Planned unit development required. Rezoning applications requesting zoning under this division shall be subject to the requirements of 31-256.9 of this division, if applicable.

The project area is undeveloped and sits between observed "R-1" zoned single-family homes to the west and "R-2" zoned duplex development to the north. There is a large commercial storage facility to the east and an undeveloped "R-3A" zoned tract of land along the south right-of-way of Vahrenkamp Drive.

**Land Use Plan:** This area is designated as 'General Commercial' on the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) of the Comprehensive Plan.

**Plan Recommendation:** The 'General Commercial' character encourages a wide range of commercial, retail and service uses, at varying scales and intensities depending on the site.

**Consistency:** The zoning request is not consistent with the intent of the Comprehensive Plan; therefore, the applicant has submitted a concurrent FLUM amendment request to 'General Residential' (GR) to align this project with the intended scope of development.

#### **THE ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:**

#### Which alternative is recommended? Why?

The City Council shall take the following Pharr v. Tippitt guidelines into consideration making a decision on a zoning request:

Development of this property has not occurred; therefore, this discrete item is not currently budgeted.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the applicant's zoning request from "B-5" (Business District) to "R-2" (Two Family Residential District) by a vote of 3 to 2, with Commissioners McLaurin and Peters in opposition to the request. The dissenting Commissioners supported the residents' shared concerns regarding the potential for increased traffic as a result of the proposed residential project. The staff notified thirty-four (34) surrounding property owners regarding this request and received protests from the following individuals: James E. Skinner, 4605 Lauren Mackenzie Drive; Rick and Michaela Smith, 4608 Chelsea Drive; Chris Albright, 4701 Lauren Mackenzie Drive and Adalberto Ortiz, 4501 Chelsea Drive. The residents stated they had concerns about traffic and pedestrian safety in the neighborhood. Following the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting, staff received an opposition response from Phillip and Bridget Balque of 4401 Lauren Mackenzie Drive.

B. HOLD a public hearing and consider a request submitted by M. A. Hoard Construction Co. II, Ltd., to rezone Lot 41, Block 1, Grover Park, from "B-5" (Business District) to "R-3A" (Multifamily Apartment Residential District). The property is locally known as 6501 Vahrenkamp Drive, Killeen, Texas.

Chairman Frederick requested staff comments.

City Planner, Tony McIlwain, stated that the applicants request is to allow duplex development. Staff recommends approval of the applicant's "R-2" (Two Family Residential District) zoning for the property. The "R-2" zoning request satisfies the applicant's development intent. The staff notified thirty-four (34) surrounding property owners regarding this request. Staff has received no responses.

Mr. Pedro Quintero, Quintero Engineering, L.L.C., 415 E. Avenue D, Killeen, Texas, was present to represent this request.

Chairman Frederick opened the public hearing.

The following spoke in opposition: James E. Skinner, 4605 Lauren Mackenzie Drive; Rick and Michaela Smith, 4608 Chelsea Drive; Chris Albright, 4701 Lauren McKenzie Drive and Adalberto Ortiz, 4501 Chelsea Drive. The residents stated they had concerns about traffic and pedestrian safety in the neighborhood.

With no one else requesting to speak, the public hearing was closed.

Vice Chair Dorroh motioned to recommend approval of the "R-2" (Two Family Residential District) request. Commissioner Latham seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-2, with Commissioners McLaurin and Peters in opposition to the applicant's request. The dissenting Commissioners stated that they supported the resident's concerns regarding increased traffic.

Chairman Frederick stated that this request will be forwarded to City Council with a recommendation to approve.


