- The Failure to Appear Program allows the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to contract with a political subdivision to provide information necessary for the department to deny renewal of the driver's license of a person who fails to appear for a complaint or citation or fails to pay or satisfy a judgment of the court*
- The DPS contracts with a third-party vendor to oversee this automated system

*Texas Transportation Code 706.002

- This contract requires an interlocal agreement in compliance with Chapter 791, Government Code and the Texas Transportation Code 706.008
- The contract is subject to the ability of the parties to pay the third-party vendor services required under the contract.
- An interlocal agreement with the DPS is currently in place
- The agreement was originally signed in 2004 and then amended in 2012 in compliance with changes implemented with the 82nd Legislative Session

- The agreement was once again amended in 2020 with changes implemented in the 88th Legislative Session
- Due to changes occurring in the 90th Legislative Session, DPS revised the Failure to Appear Interlocal Cooperation Contract (ICC) to conform with the legislative mandates
- The first change is to the language and restructuring of the original ICC to provide clarity regarding responsibilities held by each party

- The inclusion of indigency into the program as mandated by House Bill 291
- Language to account for future changes to the current statute ensuring the ICC remains in compliance with the latest legal requirements until a revised ICC is available
- These changes require a new contract to be entered into by both parties

There will be no expenditures of City funds for this program; however, \$10.00 is assessed on every case that is reported to the DPS as delinquent. The defendant is required to remit payment of the \$10.00 fee prior to releasing the hold on their driver's license; \$4.00 of the fee is retained by the city

Recommendation

Staff recommends entering into interlocal agreement with DPS to deny renewal of the driver's license of a person who fails to appear for a complaint or citation or fails to pay or satisfy a judgment ordering payment

This is an effective tool used by municipal courts to gain compliance from defendants who would otherwise ignore a complaint, citation, or order of the court

This Municipal Court clears approximately 7,300 cases each year as a result of utilizing this program
