AWARD BID NO. 24-23 TRANSFER STATION CRANE



Background

- The Transfer Station relies on two stationary grapple cranes to compact municipal solid waste (msw) into departing trailers to maximum capacity.
 - □ One purchased in 2015 and on purchased in 2019.
- The Builtrite purchased in 2015 has reached the end of its operational lifespan, frequently experiencing overheating issues necessitating shutdowns.
- On September 12, 2023, City Council approved the FY24 CIP budget which included purchase of a replacement crane.

- On January 25, 2024, Purchasing received three (3) bids in response to Bid No. 24-23, Transfer Station Grapple Crane.
 - National Equipment Dealers (2)
 - Waste Systems Equipment, Inc
- □ Funds are allocated in the FY24 CIP budget for the crane in the amount of \$436,135.
