



MEDICAL AND NURSING

DATA FROM 2016

- Family Planning Services
 - Approximately 500 patients seen monthly
 - Total: ~6,000 annually
- Other Services include:
 - TB testing and treatment
 - Community Education
 - Disease Surveillance
 - Immunizations
 - STD Testing and Treatment
- Funding
 - DSHS/HHSC Grants
 - Immunizations
 - Healthy Texas Women
 - Federal Title X
 - 1115 Waiver

PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS (PHEP)

- All hazards preparedness
 - Natural disasters
 - Disease outbreaks/epidemics
 - Bioterrorism
 - Any event that can negatively impact community function
- Coordination with state, local, and federal entities to develop response plans and exercise them.
- Disease Surveillance
 - 543 disease investigations conducted in 2016
 - ~ 25 outbreak investigations
- Mosquito trapping and testing
- STD Task Force

WOMEN, INFANTS, AND CHILDREN PROGRAM (WIC)

DATA FROM 2015

- Focus on physical and cognitive health for local children from conception through age 5.
 - Based on program participation in 2015:
 - 207,919 Benefits provided in the Bell County community among the 4 WIC locations (Killeen, Temple, Copperas Cove, Fort Hood) used in Bell County stores.
 - A \$12 million + economic benefit
