AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF KILLEEN AND JUNIOR SERVICE LEAGUE OF KILLEEN

The Junior Service League of Killeen (“Junior Service League”) and the City of Killeen agree to the following as it pertains to the purchase, installation and maintenance of an outdoor fitness court.

Junior Service League agrees to the following:

1. Contribute \$75,000 for the construction of an Outdoor Fitness Court at Lions Club Park. The sum of the all funds is derived from the breakdown of contributions listed below.
 - Junior Service League - \$75,000
 - National Fitness Campaign - \$30,000
 - City of Killeen - \$30,000
2. Provide the City of Killeen with documents related to the required signage and plaque to be located at the Outdoor Fitness Court.

City of Killeen agrees to the following related to the purchase, installation and maintenance of the outdoor fitness court:

1. Contribute a maximum of \$30,000 for the construction of an Outdoor Fitness Court at Lions Club Park.
2. Be responsible for all administrative requirements related to the grant agreement for the Fitness Court.
3. Purchase the required equipment and associated amenities for the fitness court using operating funds from within Community Services. The purchase will be made in compliance with the agreed upon layout.
4. Oversee the installation of the fitness court at Lions Club Park, located at 1600 E. Stan Schlueter Loop, in the vicinity of the Family Recreation Center.
5. Complete the project within six (6) months of executing this agreement.
6. Maintain the fitness court in a manner to ensure that the facility remains a fitness structure for the duration of its existence at Lions Club Park.
7. Correct any malfunctions of equipment at the location of the project within sixty (60) days of identifying the issues and provide written notice to the Junior Service League Board of Directors of any issues that would prevent any maintenance from being completed within (sixty) 60 days as described in this agreement.



8. Ensure that no alterations to the fitness court result in the facility being less accessible to the general public.
9. Provide written notice to the Junior Service League Board of Directors of any intent to alter the original design of the project.
10. Install signage in accordance with standard City of Killeen park signage to include the title of Junior Service League Fitness Court and placement of a Junior Service League plaque.
11. Review the agreement in twenty-five (25) years to ensure that the Outdoor Fitness Court is still beneficial to the public at Lion's Club Park.
