FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM GRANT ACCEPTANCE-REHABILITATE TERMINAL CAPITAL EQUIPMENT SYSTEM

- The existing heat, ventilating and air conditioning (HVAC) system at the Killeen-Fort Hood Regional Airport (KFHRA) is almost seventeen (17) years old
- The system is now experiencing increased maintenance issues including some major component failures, leading to increased repair costs and impacting operational efficiencies

- The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has offered the City an Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grant for the Rehabilitation of the HVAC system in the KFHRA Terminal
- The project will replace all major components of the HVAC system to include chillers, boilers, water pumps, air handlers, control systems, and other associated components

- □ The grant includes \$3,693,871 for the actual construction, \$400 reimbursement for advertising, and \$204,000 for construction administration/management, and other associated costs
- Per the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), the federal share is 100 percent
- No matching requirement
