Background & History of Grant Programs

- Grant funding comes direct from U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development
- Four formula grant programs that go to States, Cities & Counties
- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) is largest block grant
- Began in 1974 and replaced the old Urban Renewal Grant Program
- City of Killeen receives direct allocations for two of the formula grant programs – CDBG & HOME
- Neighborhood approach to improving physical, social and economic conditions within local communities

CDBG Program Priorities

- CDBG Program Activities must meet 1 of 3 National Objectives
 - Benefit low- and moderate-income persons
 - Aid in prevention/elimination of slum and blight
 - Meet community development needs having a particular urgency – natural disasters, pandemics, etc.

Categories of Eligible Activities

PUBLIC SERVICES

- Funding in this category is limited to 15% of the total annual grant from HUD
- Limited to Non-Profit or Community based organizations
- The 'service' must either be new or a quantifiable increase in the level of existing service

Categories of Eligible Activities

- Acquisition of Real Property- for a public purpose
- Disposition of Real Property if property is acquired with CDBG funding, can pay for sale, lease, appraisals, surveys, etc.
- <u>Interim Assistance</u>-limited improvements to immediately stop signs of physical deterioration
- Microenterprise Assistance stabilization of small businesses

Categories of Eligible Activities

- Public Facilities and Public Improvements
 - Community, senior, and health centers
 - Parking, streets, sidewalks
 - Parks and playgrounds
 - Water/Sewer main lines, facilities
 - Flood/drainage improvements

- Clearance & Demolition of buildings and structures; unsafe, public/health hazard
- Code Enforcement salaries only to address code violations
- Housing rehabilitation of existing structures
- Special Economic Development commercial improvements, job training, job creation
 - Carried out by grantee or nonprofit
- Program Administration limited to 20% of annual grant from HUD; planning and administration costs

CDBG Allocation from HUD FY 22

- CDBG FY 22 allocation = \$1,114,792.00
 - □ Public Services (15%) = \$ 167,218.00
 - □ Public Facilities/Improvements, Housing, other eligible activities (65%) = \$ 628,938.73
 - □ Program Administration (20%) = \$222,958.00
 - □ Program Income & Reprogrammed Funds=\$15,594.53
 - CDBG total available =\$1,130,386.53

- Largest federal block grant exclusively to create affordable housing
 - Targets low-income households
- Eligible Activities
 - Homeowner purchase, rehabilitation, financing
 - Build or rehabilitate housing for rent or ownership
 - Tenant Based Rental Assistance

HOME Program Requirements

- Affordability Period Length of time assisted unit must remain affordable to low-income persons
 - Minimum of 5 years
- Matching funds from the community -25¢ for every dollar drawn
 - Cash, In-kind, Donation of services/materials
- Required set aside for CHDOs nonprofit or communitybased housing development organizations; 15% of annual grant from HUD

HOME Allocation from HUD

- \square HOME 2022 allocation = \$ 491,222.00
 - \square CHDO set aside (15%) = \$73,684.00
 - Rental, Owner, build/rehabilitate, TBRA eligible activities (75%) + program income &reprogrammed funds = \$540,965.97
 - □ Program Administration (10%) = \$ 49,122.00
 - Total available=\$663,771.97

 - Applications sent to Eligible Applicants; Full application due by April 16, 2021
- Applicant presentations to CDAC
 - May 19-20, 2021
- □ Public Hearings June 21 and July 27, 2021
 - CDAC recommendation of funding allocation to City Council

 - How much money will it take? Where will all that money come from?
 - What organizational resources are available to address the priority needs?

Community Development Advisory Committee Process

- Met May 19th and 20thth to review all applications for funding
- Used a scoring criteria developed that placed emphasis on four areas:
 - Significance extent to which project meets a national objective & identified need in Consolidated Plan Strategy
 - Feasibility an applicant's financial or organizational capacity to carry out the proposed activity/project
 - Compliance the applicant's ability to comply with federal rules and regulations in implementing their activity/project
 - <u>Leveraging of Funds</u> does project have other possible resources directed to carry out their activity/project
