


# Background

- On July 7, 2020, City Council received the results of the 2020 Water & Sewer Rate Study
  - Water revenues are not sufficient, sewer revenues are sufficient
- City Council deferred rate adjustment due to the pandemic
- Rate adjustment is included in the proposed FY 2022 Budget
- Water rate increase recommended
  - Increase of \$1.47 per month for a customer using 5,000 gallon per month (average user)
  - Added additional volumetric rate to encourage conservation
    - Heavy users pay more

# **Out-of-City Rates**

- Review showed several customers outside of the city limits are being charged in-city rates
  - Currently, no customers charged out-of-city rates
- Higher out-of-city rates reflect higher costs to serve customers in more remote areas
- Current ordinance requires out-of-city customers to pay in-city rates plus 100%
  - Proposed ordinance will change to in-city rates plus 50%
- Out-of-city customers will be notified and begin being billed according to the ordinance

# Alternatives

- Do not amend water and sewer rates and continue using current rates
- Amend water and sewer rates

### Recommendation

Approve the ordinance amending Chapter 30, Water, Sewers, and Sewer Disposal, of the Code of Ordinances, to amend water and sewer rates
