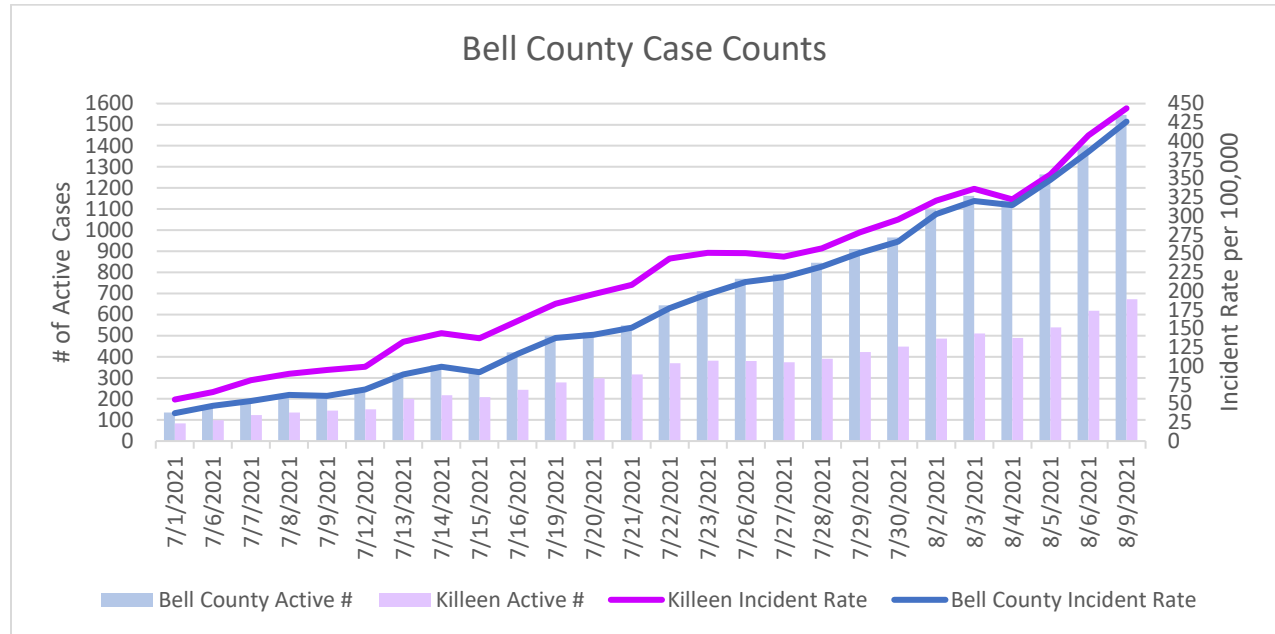

Healthcare Trauma Area L

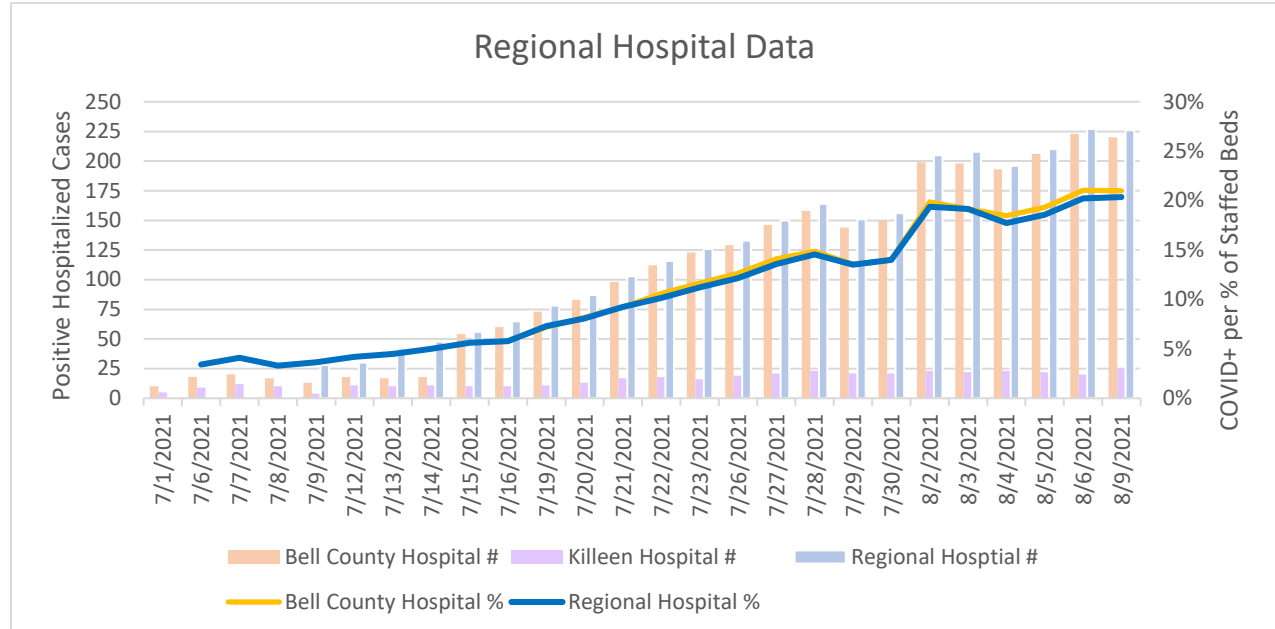

Governor Orders:

- [Executive Order 38](#) was issued on July 29, 2021
- Executive Order 37 was issued July 28, 2021
- State disaster declaration remains in effect

Funding:

- Spreadsheet updated on COVID webpage and Finance webpage
- CARES Act CDBG - \$613,676 and \$726,841
- Department of Justice - \$230,000
- CARES Act Aviation - \$2,217,498
- Coronavirus Relief Fund City direct funding – \$8.33 million total reimbursement
- Killeen is expected to receive up to \$29 million in federal aid through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021
- www.KilleenTexas.gov/COVID19 remains active and updated

City Facility Updates:

- Face coverings highly recommended in all City facilities
- Community Center open
- Senior Center re-opened on limited in person programs on March 18th (M-F 9 – 2)
- Service and capacity adjustments continue to be made in compliance with changing orders

Fort Hood Updates:

- 8.9.2021 Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin is requesting all personnel to be vaccinated by mid-September – possibly sooner if the FDA fully approves a vaccine sooner
- 8.8.2021 Health Protection Condition (HPCON) raised to HPCON BRAVO +
- 8.2.2021 General Order #1 requiring mask and restricting travel

Community Partnership: OHSEM worked with area groups on supplies they needed to perform community outreach and preparation in response to COVID-19. Since last update the following supplies have been delivered.

- **NAACP**
 - Alcohol Wipe Packets - 1,050
 - Hygiene Cards - 1,230
 - Cloth Mask 500
 - Hand Sanitizer - 86
- **COVID-19 Task Force**
 - Cloth Mask - 800
 - Thermometers - 800
 - Antibacterial Soap bottles - 800
 - Alcohol Wipe Packets – 800
- **Transient Support:**
 - Tested 87 people
 - Placed 4 people in temporary housing
- **Friends In Crisis**
 - Surgical Mask - 2,000
 - KN95 Mask - 250
 - Gloves - 5,000
 - Hard surface wipes - 20 1 gal buckets
 - **Rapid Test Kits - 50**
- **Food Care Center**
 - Gloves - 3,000
 - Bottles of cleaning spray - 24
 - Hard surface wipes - 24 1 gal buckets
 - Cloth mask - 300

Community Support/Assistance:

- **City of Killeen** – any applicant for any of these programs that needs assistance, a computer, or documents copied can call the CDBG office (254-616-3196) to schedule an appointment.
 - ⇒ **Utility Billing Assistance: Fully expensed \$216,271.15**
 - Received 1,350 applications as of 12/31/2020
 - Processed 1,147 applications totaling \$216,271.15 (1/30/2021)
 - ⇒ **Short Term Rental Assistance: Fully expensed \$158, 728.85**
 - 133 applications processed (6/9/2020)
 - ⇒ **Tenant Based Rental Assistance: Fully expensed \$76,350.67**
 - rental payments through December 31, 2020
 - 13 households consisting of 49 people
 - ⇒ **Small Business Grant Program: opened 2/3/2021 – closed at this time**
 - 56 applications submitted as of 4/5/2021
 - 55 applications in process as of 4/5/2021
 - 1 application approved for \$8,000
 - Staff hosted a Zoom technical assistance workshop 5 times where a total of 2 applicants participated
 - ⇒ **Emergency Rental & Mortgage Assistance: opened 1/21/2021 – closed at this time**
 - 827 applications submitted as of 3/1/2021
 - 0 applications still in progress
 - 122 approved for total of \$331,988
 - ⇒ **Texas Emergency Rental Assistance: opened 1/21/2021 – Reopened 6/21/2021**
 - **506 applications submitted as of 8/10/2021**
 - **506 applications still in progress**
 - **78 approved for \$318,948**
 - ⇒ **Texas Eviction Diversion** – evictions still suspended in TX through 10/1/2021
 - CD Staff are working with JPs to process eviction cases before sending to the State
 - 3 eviction diversion cases approved, paid out of Emergency Rental Assistance
