Agronomic Plan FY22

- Eliminate overseeding on fairway, tees, and greens to allow for healthier bermuda and reduced input
- Installing new irrigation control system to allow for better utilization of irrigation system
- Monthly plant growth enhancers based off soil and tissue tests
- Organic soil amendments to enrich the soil
- Periodic aerification of all maintained areas
 to relieve compaction and aid water infiltration
- Plant protectant applications to prevent new weeds and remove existing weeds
- Expansion of Monarch butterfly habitat using wildflower and native grass
- Involvement in the Audubon Sanctuary Program
- Renovating bunkers to remove rocks and debris and create a playable surface
