

Healthcare Trauma Area L



Vaccine Update:

- Booster Shots
- Per the CDC, you may choose any of the 3 brands to have for your booster shot
- Pfizer booster is fully approved for <u>specific groups</u> 18 years or older, exact same as dose of shots 1 & 2, 6 months after 2nd shot
 - 65 years and older
 - 18 years or older with high risk of sever COVID-19
 - 18 years or older who job or living condition puts them at a high risk of exposure to COVID-19
- Moderna booster is fully approved for same groups as Pfizer above, booster is ½ the dose of shots 1 & 2, 6 months after 2nd shot
- Johnson and Johnson booster is fully approved for anyone 18 years or older, exact same as first shot, 2 months after 1st shot
- Types of Vaccine and Age Requirements
- Pfizer, anyone 12 years or older can receive




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- 5 11 years recommendation has been authorized as an EUA by the FDA, now the CDC ACIP meets to discuss and develop clinical procedures – estimating 2 weeks until this age group can start getting vaccines
- Moderna, anyone 18 years or older can receive
- Johnson&Johnson, anyone 18 years or older can receive
